

The COAST Parent Involvement Plan as Part of the School Improvement Plan (Policy 1310/4002)

The principal shall publicize drafts of the parental involvement plan prior to finalization and solicit input from parents of students in the school. This plan must include, at a minimum, efforts to enhance parental involvement by promoting the following priorities:

- The COAST will involve parents in student learning by:

- The COAST will encourage volunteering in the school by providing a list of opportunities to parents through the school website and newsletter.
- The COAST will involve parents in school decisions that affect children and families by
 - Meeting with Parent Advisory Council
 - Including parents on School Improvement Team
 - Including opportunities for feedback in the COASTal Currents Newsletter
- The COAST will provide parental training based on parents' informational needs as gathered by:
 - Parent Feedback Surveys
- The COAST will collaborate with community agencies and other organizations to provide resources to strengthen school programs, families, and student learning by collaborating with cooperating agencies.
- The COAST will promote student health awareness among parents by addressing the need for health programs and student health services linked to student learning through open communication with the school nurse.
