Speaker 1 Character: Leroy

Speaker 2 Character: Ms./Mr. Gaffney-*Feel free to genderbend the teacher.*

(Wings flapping then landing)

Leroy: (Gets off from Listener's back) Phew! I'm glad I took your word to try out flying.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: Yeah. It was good for me to do this.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: I know. For once I'm calm.

(Listener responds, both they and Leroy start walking)

Leroy: (Sighs) Well, I'll have to face the music tomorrow...possibly sooner..(Groans)

(Listener responds)

Leroy: Why would I forget about that? You know me. I keep these sorts of things close to heart and mind.

(Listener responds, teasing)

Leroy: (Sighs) Yes I know. That's why I'm a worry wart. You don't have to keep reminding me.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: I know I don't have to think so much about it now. Still, it's on the mind because I'll have to face my disobedience. Plus...ugh...I have to ask her/him how to reverse the spell on you. Or, she/he would have to do it herself/himself because she/he doesn't trust me and-

(Listener responds, interrupting)

Leroy: (Worried) Sorry, but I can't be calm now. (Saddened) I'll be expelled. I just know it.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: You know...I don't understand how you're so relaxed about everything.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: How can you not worry about anything?! That doesn't make sense!

(Listener responds)

Leroy: Ah...well, I guess when you put it like that, it makes sense. Sometimes, you have to take things as they are. There may be a chance for a different outcome, but it's not always guaranteed.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: (Warm) I do appreciate you putting up with me.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: I couldn't have asked for a better friend.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: (Confused, slightly nervous) Uh...hehehe what's with that expression? What's wrong?

(Listener responds)

Leroy: (Stunned) Gah! It-It's her/him! Ms./Mr. Gaffney!?

(Hurried footsteps as Ms./Mr. Gaffney storms up to Leroy and Listener)

Ms./Mr. Gaffney: Do you have any idea of the mess you've caused?!

Leroy: (Nervous) Hi ma'am/sir.

Ms./Mr. Gaffney: This is not the time for greetings! (Scolding) I'm very disappointed in you. I had thought you better than this.

Leroy: (Still nervous) Ma'am/Sir, I-I...I'm sorry...I didn't mean for it to go that far.

(Listener cuts off Ms./Mr. Gaffney by roaring)

(Listener responds)

(Listener responds)

(Listener responds)

Ms./Mr. Gaffney: (Finding Listener odd) I see...

Leroy: Ms./Mr. Gaffney...I...

Ms./Mr. Gaffney: (Sighs, talking to Leroy) I will let you off this time. However, do not let this happen again. Do you understand?

Leroy: (Relieved) Y-Yes ma'am/sir. Thank you!

(Listener responds)

(Listener responds)

(Listener responds)

Leroy: I suppose small doses of roaring wouldn't hurt. Don't overdo it though.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: Hey! I'm just following my teacher's instructions. She's/He's right after all.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: Are you pulling my leg? You want to take me flying and make my heart literally soar from intensity again?!

(Listener responds)

Leroy: (Laughs) I'm kidding. I don't mind that at all.

(Listener responds)

Leroy: Yes really! I don't mind. Let's fly some more! That is, if your wings aren't too worn out.

(Listener responds by roaring)

Leroy: Alright!

(Wings flapping, ascending into the air)

(Listener responds)
