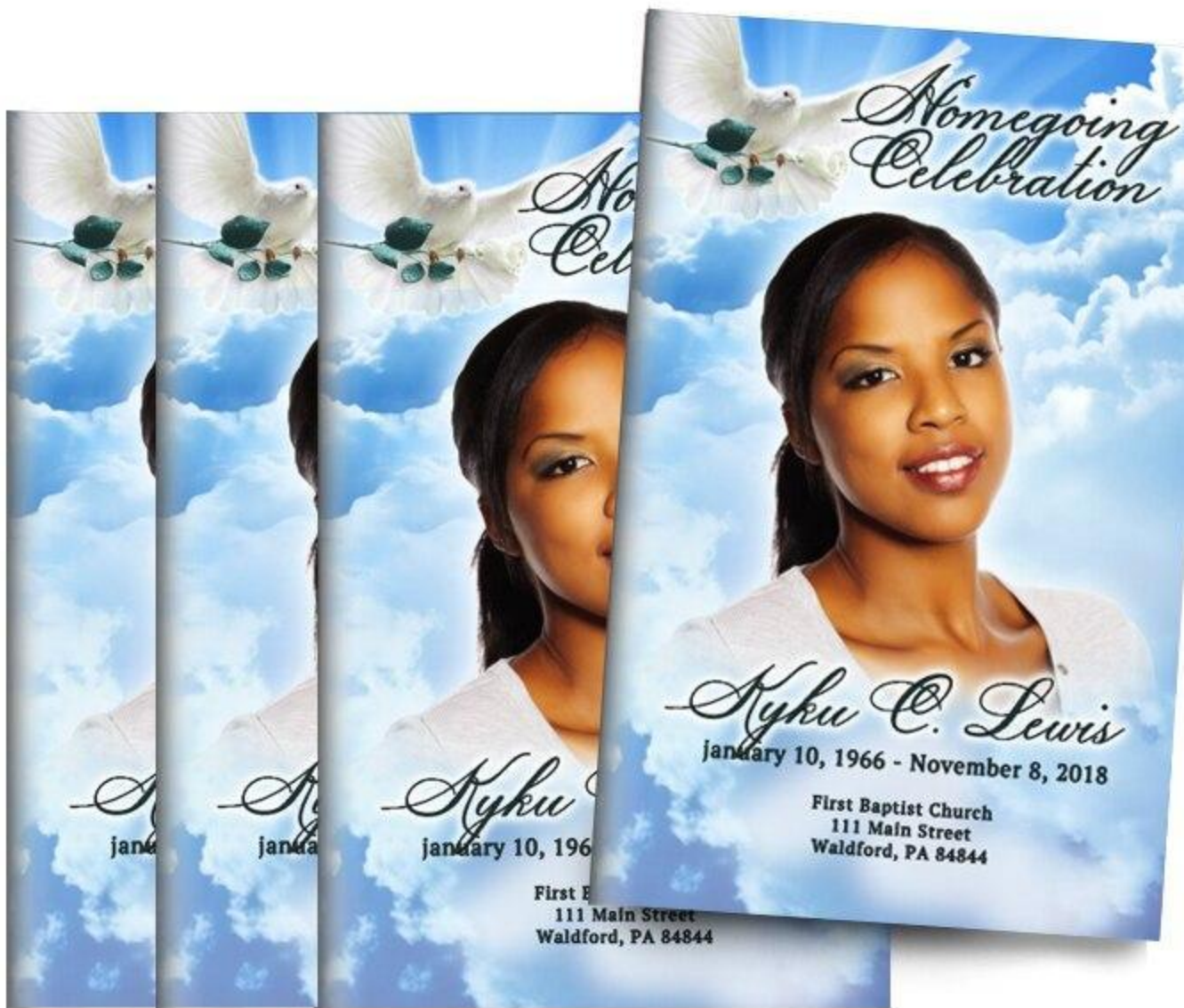


Funeral Program

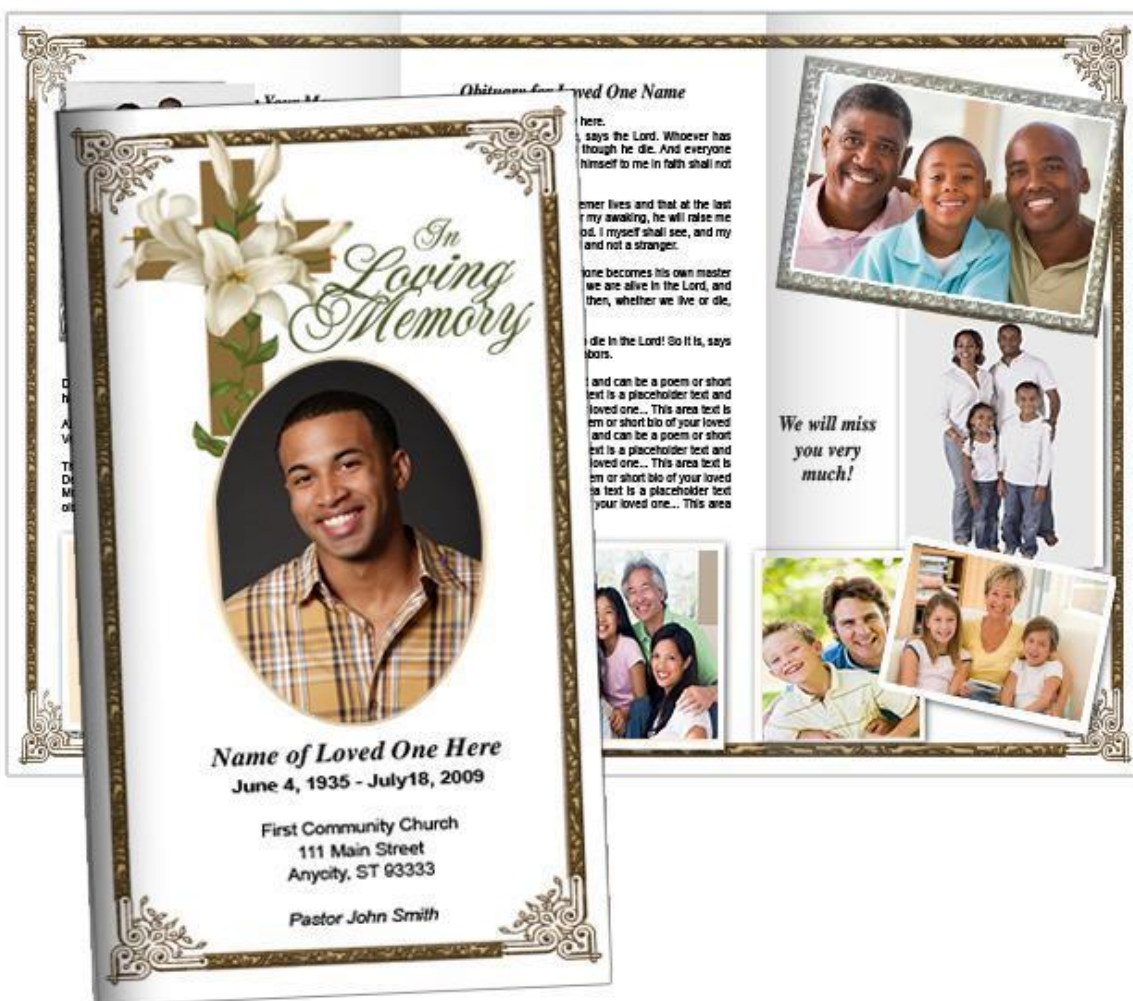
