	PEOPLE	PLACES	THINGS
some– <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An unknown person, place, or thing. • It is often used in affirmative sentences. • Used with third-person singular verbs. 	Someone <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Someone is knocking at the door.</i> • Refers to a person from a group of people I know. Somebody <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Somebody is knocking at the door.</i> • Refers to a non-specific person in the world. 	Somewhere <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>I know there is a job for me somewhere. I just need to find it.</i> 	Something <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>There is something crawling in the bathtub!</i>
Any– <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Not a specific person, place, or thing. • Use it in questions and negative sentences. • Used with third-person singular verbs. 	Anyone <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Refers to an unspecified person from a group of people that I know. Anybody <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Refers to an unspecified person in the world. 	Anywhere <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>I need a vacation. I will go anywhere that doesn't have dirty dishes to wash!</i> 	Anything <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Can I do anything to help you?</i>
No– <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • no single, unspecified person, place, or thing. 	No one <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>No one wants to go shopping with me.</i> • Refers to an unspecified 	Nowhere <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>This is an animal found nowhere else in the world!</i> 	Nothing <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>There is nothing to eat in the refrigerator!</i>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Used with third-person singular verbs. 	<p>person from a group of people that "I" know.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • May be used with a noun. <i>No one <u>person</u> can do everything.</i> • Considered a little more formal than "nobody." <p>Nobody</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nobody wants to buy her car. • Refers to not one person in the world. 		
<p>Every-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • means all the people, places, or things in a place. • Used with third-person singular verbs. 	<p>Everyone</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Everyone is invited.</i> • Includes all people from a group of all the people I know in the world. <p>Everybody</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Everybody likes cheese.</i> • Includes all the people in the world 	<p>Everywhere</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>I searched everywhere in the house, and I still can't find it.</i> 	<p>Everything</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I have everything that I need to make the soup.
