

College and Career High School Lesson Schedule Career-Major-College

Learning Objectives: Students who understand their future and how they will arrive at that vision are more likely to see the relevance in their current courses. The goal is for all students to continue their education past high school, gaining skills and knowledge to ensure their employability. This education path will look different for each student. Some students may pursue a Certificate Program or Associate's Degree, while others may desire a Bachelor's Degree and graduate school. The purpose of these lessons is to give them the knowledge of choosing a career, a major, and finally, a college or university.

Directions: Each lesson is self-explanatory and does not require prep time. The video should be viewed as a class, followed by time for students to work on the assigned task on CaliforniaColleges.edu. Teachers may share the URL to the lesson with students. The lessons contain links to everything students need to locate on CaliforniaColleges.edu.

New students who have not registered their CaliforniaColleges.edu account need to use their VUSD email to register their account. Students who had a CaliforniaColleges.edu account in another district will need to login using their previous login information AND then click on the person icon in the top right corner. After clicking on the icon, a drop down menu will appear and the student will click on "My Account". Select "Edit" and they can add a secondary person email.
