Pajamarama was a tween/teen oriented talk show. I'm not exactly sure when the show was made but my best guess is sometime in the mid 2000s. The only thing I do know is that (i presume) a 26 episode DVD was released in the fall of 2008.

The show was hosted by 6 teen girls including the late Naya Rivera and 5 other girls (Naykia, Skyler, Elizabeth, Courtney, and Kaila). The show focused on topics like fashion, makeup/beauty, fitness, music, pop culture, etc. The show also featured guests including Avril Lavgine, Kenan Thompson, Raven Symone, Maroon 5, etc.

The main part of the show was filmed on a set designed to be like a girl's bedroom for a sleepover. While other portions were filmed in public (such as at malls) where they would interview real girls to get their opinions.

There was a website, although even in the Wayback Machine it led to nothing but an ad to buy the domain. Although based on the trailer (which I will mention in a bit), the website featured games, blogs, contests, and a contact section where viewers could email the hosts about topics and such.

While this may seem like quite a bit of information, this all only comes from 2 sources

I dm'd the person who runs the instagram and asked where they got the photo and if they knew anything more about the show. They said they didn't know anymore about the show than I did and that the photo (which I cannot find anywhere else) was saved to their phone quite a while ago and they don't remember the source.

It seems Susie Singer Carter runs a production company called "Go Girl Media" although on her website it mentions nothing about the program. HOWEVER, in the trailer it says "from the producers/writers" of CAKE" (which was a show airing on both the KOL's Secret Slumber Party and KEWLopolis weekend blocks on CBS from 2006-2009). Susie was a writer for the show. I emailed Susie today but haven't gotten an email back quite yet (i'll let ya know if I do).

One thing I noticed in the photo was it had the E/I (Education/Informational) symbol. Which generally E/I programs (not aimed at small children) air on children's weekend blocks. I thought Slumber Party and Pajamas and obviously those go hand in hand. Couldn't find anything though. There was something called 'The Slumber Party Girls' but, not the same thing nor are any of the members connected.

Monday October 26, 2020: asked SewerReviewer for help with this project Tuesday October 27, 2020: sent an email to Susie Singer Carter (writer or producer for the show and posted trailer video in November of 2008)

Thursday October 29, 2020: found IMDB of possible actress on the show (Naykia Harris) IMDB showed nothing of the show and no activity since 2002. She also had no social media.

Found IMDB of actress on the show (Kaila Amariah) although the IMDB did not display the show as a credit, the actress and girl in the clips looked identical. Had active social media. Sent direct message on Instagram. Got a response (she was in the show). Asked questions.

Kaila responded stating the show was filmed around 2004. However, only a pilot was filmed but it never made it to the air.

Realized what about the poster that promoted 26 episodes coming to DVD (or some form of home video)? She said that they most definitely did not film 26 episodes. Maybe 5 at the most.

Found the name of another actress from the show (who Kaila had kept in contact with for a while after the show) Skyler Shaye.

Funny enough, Skyler was in the Bratz movie in 2007 which ironically NLT (which Kevin McHale was in) was in the movie....so she has worked with 2 Glee stars, interesting.

Friday October 30, 2020: I was up since 2am and couldn't fall back asleep. But that got me thinking, if the show was filmed with a max of 5 episodes around 2004, and it never aired, why would there be a poster in 2008 promoting a home video release of 26 episodes?

I decided to DM Skyler Shaye.
