Goals

Year 12 Classical Studies aims to provide students with a knowledge and appreciation of selected areas of Greek civilisation which in many cases form the basis of modern Western civilisation. Students will also complete an in-depth study of Alexander the Great. It encourages students to compare classical civilisation, contemporary New Zealand, and world issues. It provides a variety of subject matter including history, politics, literature and art which will interest and stimulate students.

Topic	NZQF Standard Code	Content	Teaching Time
Introduction to Classical Studies	N/A	Students will be taken through a series of introductory lessons in which they will be introduced to the classical world and the skills that they will learn while studying Classical Studies this year. These lessons will include information or selected pūrākau that depict important places, individuals (such as Greek or Roman gods) and events that make up the classical world. These lessons will also include an introduction to using primary sources.	2 weeks
Mythology - The world of the heroes	AS91204 (2.5) and AS91200 (2.1)	Ākonga will then explore the key qualities of the Greek hero and the role they played in Greek mythology and Religion. They will examine hero myths and begin to understand how to use primary sources, identifying the ways in which different heroes display these qualities through the reading of The 12 Labours of Hercules and The Odyssey.	14 weeks

Alexander the Great	AS91202 (2.3) and AS 91203 (2.4)	Students will do an in-depth study of Alexander the Great, from his birth to his death. Students will explore his military achievements and look at the impact that Alexander had on civilisation then and now.	14 weeks
