On **Monday, January 31st**, the Disabled Student Union will be staging a demonstration against the in-person attendance requirement and lack of ensured remote access to courses, with the full support of the Undergraduate Students Association Council and the Mother Organization Coalition. These efforts will be centrally located in **Royce Quad** by the Flag Pole, beginning at **9 a.m.**, followed by a march to Murphy Hall at **12 p.m.** There will also be ways to participate virtually, including virtual attendance to the march.

We are urging **all students, staff, and workers** to join in our efforts to show UCLA that we will not learn or work under these unsafe and ableist conditions. On January 31st, stand in solidarity with the DSU and all those affected by the pandemic by refusing to attend in-person classes and by joining the demonstration. All deserve the right to choose how they would like to learn, teach, and work, in a way that is safe and accessible to them.

"We would like to clarify that **we are not asking for remote only classes**. Rather, we are advocating for giving students the agency and option in their education (which we are paying for) to attend classes remotely if they do not deem it safe to attend in-person. [Hybrid options] will not only benefit immunocompromised students, but students with dependents, commuter students, students who test positive, students who are exposed to COVID, students who live with at-risk family members, and numerous other groups."

For far too long, UCLA's DSU has been fighting for permanent hybrid access to our education. Despite garnering nearly [30,000 signatures](#) in support of this cause and the support of prominent disability activists, UCLA and the COVID Response and Recovery Task Force still refuse to take action and protect the community. UCLA continually shows that it prioritizes in-person activities and profit over the health and safety of its students, faculty, and staff.
