Updated from Crary Huff/Miyuki:

Laura/Crary Huff is recommending the following:

- Related to the Articles of Incorporation and our organization's type/size, we don't meet the legal definition of members because we charge no dues and lack a clear way to designate membership ownership. *However, she will draft wording to indicate that there are members in the bylaws.*
- This point coincides with the point above, she recommended a common practice in non-profits: setting up a **self-perpetuating board**.
 - Under this type of board the officers would hold the sole authority to select, elect, and replace our own successors. These types of boards are believed to have more stability.
- As a group we had already discussed different term lengths for the officer positions. She highly recommended staggering the terms.
 - She recommended changing the term lengths to three years for President/VP, two years for Treasurer/Secretary, and one year for Auditor/Members at Large.
 - She recommended changing our board size to "**no fewer than 5 minimum and no grader than 11 members**". She mentioned that new small boards typically have 3 to 7 members, an odd number to prevent ties.
 - She also recommended Melissa as a member at large for the board.
- For our application, we also need a Conflict of Interest document and Consent Organizational Minutes which she will prepare and have for us to review and sign within the next 2 weeks. Once we review and make any changes as needed; all board members will need to sign these documents for submission to the state.
- Lastly, she recommended that the law firm act as the organization's agent to avoid failing to file reports, etc.

She will work directly with Henjes, Conners & Williams, PC to file the IRS documents and obtain our 501(c)(3) determination. An in-kind donation to the group will cover all application and associated fees.
