M&M Docents: Quick Facts

- M&M is a group of interested adult volunteers from the community, trained to go into classrooms and present short ready-to-teach art history and accompanying art lessons.
- Training of new M&M docents begins soon after school starts. We provide all instructional materials.
- Time commitment is flexible. M&M docents sign up to provide classroom presentations at times that work with both their and the requesting teacher's schedule.

First Meeting of the 2023-24 School year: Friday, September 29, 2023; 10:00 - 11:30 a.m.. Location: Art Ed District Office Portable "F" (Corner of Churchill & Castilleja/Paly football field)

Overview:

"Meet and Make" is an art/art history experience, involving a two-part classroom presentation to K-5 students. Students learn how artists communicate through their art, engage in conversations with the docent about the work, and then create a related art project. Each of the two lesson series is approximately 50 minutes.

Our slide presentations include interesting biographical elements, historical context, and examples of the artist's work, appropriate for school aged children. Docents narrate the presentation, while challenging students to engage in, think about, and respond to the work. They also lead students in a related art lesson.

Process:

- Artists currently in our M & M portfolio are listed below.
- District elementary teachers request artist presentations early in the fall.
- Docents choose the artists they want to present (not all docents present all of the artists).
- M&M docent communicates with teacher to schedule a lesson.

Time Commitment and Training:

- **Docent commitment depends upon interest and availability.** Docents can sign up for presentations that work with their personal schedules.
- Initial commitment will encompass two 2-hour training meetings, as well as time spent observing two actual M&M lessons by an experienced docent (4 hours, flexible times).
- Docents gather for a 90-minute monthly Friday morning meeting during the school year.
- Pre-lesson preparation includes familiarization with slide presentations and organization of art materials for classroom visits.
