The 2025-2026 FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is open and available to be completed! All seniors must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)- this is a graduation requirement.

Next Steps This Spring

- Arrange visits at colleges you've been accepted to (in-person or virtual).
- If you haven't already, fill out [FAFSA or the Alternative Application](#) or complete the non-participation form.
- Review your college acceptances and [compare financial aid offers](#).
- Contact a school's financial aid office if you have questions about offered financial aid.
- When you decide which school you want to attend, notify that school of your commitment and submit any required financial deposit. Typically, schools require this decision by May 1, but check with your individual institution.
