7th Grade Girls Defeat Pike

On Monday, the GUS 7th grade girls pushed their season record to 6-1 with a convincing 26-14 home victory over Pike. The girls used their tried and true recipe, combining a tough defense with good passing on the offensive end for victory, to earn the win. The Boars never trailed in the game after opening a 4-0 lead early on, and by halftime they had stretched their lead to 16-10.

Maggie Delay once again led the scoring, dropping in 10 first half points which included a pair of 3 point shots. Aisling Twombly, Luka Bornhorst and Elsa Reulet each added a bucket in the first half to account for the scoring. Piper Shepherd and Ava Meyer were facilitating the play from their guard position, and Kryn Fortune was making good passes from her position

on the wing. Defensively, the girls were stingy, especially in the second half. Sparked by the incredible hustle from Reulet, the girls limited the visiting Pike Quills to just 4 second half points. On the offensive end of the court, the girls continued to share the ball. Shepherd hit a shot from the baseline, Twombly and Reulet each added another basket and Delay added two more hoops to give her a game high 14.

The 7th grade girls will be back in action on Monday when they host the Waldorf Moraine Hawks in a 4:30 game in Braemar. They will also be home on Thursday, when North Shore Christian comes to Beverly Farms for a 3:30 contest.

Pike Gets By 8th Grade Girls

On Monday, a tough Pike School team came to Braemar and defeated the host 8th grade girls 31-18. The GUS girls began the game slowly and found themselves trailing 9-0 early on and 15-4 at halftime. Pike used an uptempo game that led to several fast break baskets and a tough person to person defense which stymied the Boars. Lila Graves, nursing a sore ankle, notched the GUS points in the half on a pair of drives to the basket. Thea Glass, Mikaila Bennett and Catherine Carroll worked hard against the tough Pike defense to lead the offense but found it tough going. Zoe Moriarty, Anna Levitt, and Eliza Loring played on the wings defensively and did well, as did Carroll, Bennett and Glass. In the paint,

After the break the GUS girls gained some footing and outscored their guests 18-16 for the half. Carroll tossed in 6 points while Graves, Grant and Bennett each had 4 in the half. In the end though it just wasn't enough against the talented Pike squad, but coach Jamie Tafoya was proud of her team for the effort they displayed until the final horn sounded.

Boys Teams Fall At Pike

On Monday, both the 7th and 8th grade boy's basketball teams headed to Andover to take on the always tough Pike School Quills. The 8th graders took the court first and had a tough task ahead of them in a talented Pike squad. The Boars were a bit shorthanded with two regulars out of action but they played hard from start to finish despite absorbing a lopsided 60-21 loss. By halftime, Pike had raced out to a 33-12 lead with hoops coming in the paint, behind the arc and everywhere in between. The second half was much the same with Pike continuing to shoot well and the visiting Boars as cold as a winter morning. Cade Furse led the Boars with 11 points and several rebounds. Sammy Parisi drained a pair of three pointers in the second half, and Henry Nelson and Marshall Aptt each added a pair. Cal White, Will Fogelgren, Morgan Proops and Elliott Thompson each showed good hustle throughout the game.

The seventh grade boys took the court after the 8th grade boys game, and like their older schoolmates struggled dropping a 38-14 decision. The host Pike Quills began the game with some hot shooting and by halftime had a 27-4 lead. The Jr. Boars were playing hard but the more experienced hosts just had too much talent and size for the GUS boys to overcome. The second half saw some improvement for the Boars, but it was a case of having too much of a

deficit to climb all the way back from. Waler Nelson was a bright spot for the boys on offense throwing in 10 points and he also grabbed several rebounds. Freddy Kniker added 4 points for the Boars. Luke Kotwicki, Ben O'Connor, and Johnny Sheridan battled tough all day under the boards against their tall counterparts. Nathaniel Flynn, Ethan Watts and Sammy Kniker, and Max Crafton had their work cut out for them against the talented guards and wing players of Pike and never let up. Coach Carson Connor was upbeat with the boys effort despite the tough loss.

8th Grade Girls Run Past Tigers

On Tuesday, the GUS 8th grade girls hosted the Tower Tigers and cruised to a 23-11 victory in Braemar. The Boars were in control of this one right from the opening jump ball. After jumping out to a 4-0 lead, the Boars never trailed in the game. Lucy Grant and Lila Graves each put in 4 first half points and Zoe Moriarty added two, helping push the Boars ahead 10-4 when the halftime horn sounded. Ani Stephan joined Grant and Graves in controlling the rebounding. Thea Glass, Eliza Loring, Mikaila Bennett, and CatherineCarroll rotated through at guard and did nice work on both ends of the court. Glass also contributed several good assists throughout the game. Anna Leavitt and Claire Lewis contributed as forwards, and also logged some time at guard.

The second half saw the girls extend their lead behind 9 more points from Graves who had a game high 13 points overall. Grant and Stephan each added a hoop to make the final score. Defense is where the girls really shined, as they limited the Tigers opportunities with a tough, ballhawking defense. This was a total team victory with all the girls making solid contributions to the win.

After the halftime break, the Boars began to heat up offensively. Good ball movement, spearheaded by Nathaniel Flynn, led to good shots highlighted by 6 second half points for Kotwicki. This good ball movement also led to six different players scoring in the half. Ben O'Connor hit a deep 3 pointer and Johnny Sheridan, Max Crafton, Freddy Kniker and Sammy Kniker each added 2 points. Sheridan joined Kotwicki in controlling the boards, limiting Tower to one shot

Tower immediately fouled Furse with 5.9 seconds remaining, and he calmly knocked down the two foul shots to give the Boars a 4 point lead at 41-37 and essentially decided the game when Tower could not convert at the buzzer.

Henry Nelson played possibly his best game of the season. He went the entire game playing very well on the defensive and offensive end. Not only did he grab several rebounds, notching a few steals, dishing off numerous assists, he also knocked down two huge 3 point shots in the pivotal second half comeback. Marshall Aptt was a force on the backboards and tossed in 4 points. Cal White showed great hustle and desire throughout the game and Sammy Parisi exhibited true leadership and hustle during the first half to go along with 2 points.

It was an impressive performance by the Boars paced by the talented Furse and the hustle of all his teammates. The boys will get back on the court next Monday when they make the short trip to Landmark on Monday for a 4:45 game.
