FIRST DAY FORM REMINDERS!

All families must complete the First Day Forms for each student attending SLHS in the fall. There is very important information that must be reviewed and submitted for each student. Please read and complete ALL of these online forms through our website or by clicking the link <u>SLHS FIRST DAY FORMS</u>. Failure to complete the forms could result in students' computers being locked.



We are proud to welcome back all of our students on August 25th. Our first day schedule for the 2025-2026 school year will model the first day schedule we have used previously. We will have time set aside for Freshmen to get acclimated with the building, as well as activities for our upperclassmen to get their year started strong.

Below you will find the layout for all students (based) on their grade for how the first day of school will run. ALL NON LCTI STUDENTS will report to school and be in their homeroom by 7:35. ALL AM LCTI STUDENTS will report to school and report the LCTI buses in the bus loop by 7:30 AM. All Seniors who have earned Late Arrival privilege must be in homeroom on August 25th by 7:35 AM. Late arrival privileges do not begin until the second day of school, August 26th..

FRESHMEN

- b) Students will review their schedule on their computer

School Breakfast and Lunch Information

"No cost" breakfast for all students will continue for the 2025-2026 school year!

Funding for "no cost" breakfast has been approved! Breakfast will be available for all students free of charge for the entire 2025-2026 school year!

In the event of a 2 hour delay, breakfast will NOT be served. This applies to the entire 2025-2026 school year.

Enrolled students who are in-school learning will be able to get a breakfast meal in their school cafeteria. No breakfast distribution to remote students will happen at this time. Breakfast menus are available by <u>CLICKING HERE</u>.

The listed serving times below may be adjusted as necessary. We will notify parents/guardians of any schedule changes.

• Southern Lehigh High will serve breakfast from 7:15am to 7:30am.

A breakfast meal consists of an entrée item (breakfast sandwich, yogurt & muffin, mini waffles, bagel, Pop Tarts, etc.), fruit or fruit juice, and a choice of milk. A fruit or fruit juice and milk <u>must</u> be taken to receive a breakfast meal deal price. Gluten free options include 1 bowl of GF Cereal (currently Honey Cheerios or Lucky Charms) or 2 - 4oz. Yogurt or 2 String Cheese Sticks or 1 - 4oz. Yogurt & 1 String Cheese Stick, fruit or fruit juice, and a choice of milk. A fruit or fruit juice and milk <u>must</u> be taken to receive a GF breakfast meal deal price.

- 1 "no cost" breakfast will be offered to all students. Additional breakfast meals on the same day will be charged to a student's account accordingly.
- Items that are not chosen as part of a meal deal (single milk, single fruit, single main entrée item, etc.) must be charged to a student's account as an À la carte item. All 3 breakfast components, as listed above, must be taken to qualify as a meal.
- Students will pick up their breakfast in their school's cafeteria.

"No Cost" Reduced Lunch Information

Funding by the State of Pennsylvania for "No Cost" reduced priced meals, to cover the \$0.40 reduced lunch charge for those students who qualify for that benefit, will continue for the entire 2025-2026 school year. Students who qualify for reduced price meals will be provided "no cost" lunch for the 2025-2026 school year.

Additional Information

While the outlook for the 2025-2026 school year looks more stable than the previous year, there are still some items that are having production and availability issues. We expect to be able to source 95% of the items we usually use to provide healthy school meals that follow the necessary guidelines. There could be times that we will not receive what we order, which will necessitate a menu change in the week or even the day of service.

When there is a need to change menu items, the Lead Food Service Worker notifies the main office of their school, so the menu change can be communicated to the students. When we are aware that a menu change is necessary a day or more in advance, an email will be sent out to notify parents. We are striving to ensure product shortages and menu changes do not happen.

Please keep in mind, menus are created with the expectation of not having supply concerns. So, we continue to ask for everyone's patience and understanding during these extended unusual times. Thank you.

The SLHS Open house for the 2025-2026 school year will be on Tuesday, August 26th, 2025.

The objective of this Open House is to allow you to meet the faculty and obtain information about your student(s) courses. The program this year will run from 6:15 pm to 8 pm. Each session will be approximately 10 minutes, where teachers will share course requirements, policies, procedures, and any specific information for their class. There will not be enough time to answer individual questions about your particular student.

There will be 3-4 minutes in between sessions for parents to navigate the hallways. Parents will follow their student(s) Day 1 (Odd) and Day 2 (Even) schedules, which can be found in Infinite Campus. Following the odd and even day schedule will allow you to meet all of your student's teachers. To find your student(s) scheduled in Infinite Campus, log in and go directly to the home page. Once on the home page, the left-hand menu has the option of "Schedule" which will allow you to see your student(s) classes.

We understand and are aware that some families may have multiple children in the building and there may be conflicts with meeting all of your student's teachers, either by a conflict of period or more student schedules than parents who are available. MORNING PARENT DROP-OFF PROTOCOL




For the 2025-2026 Southern Lehigh High School will be continuing with the same student drop-off procedure that was in place for the 2024-2025 school year. After a full year of review, the drop-off procedural adjustment did limit the number of vehicles crossing each other and expedited the drop-off procedure for parents.

The map below displays the two drop-off loops for parents. Please note that if you enter the school campus off of Route 309, you are required to exit onto 309. If you enter off of the circle on Preston Lane, you are required to exit back onto Preston Lane.

For the first 2 to 3 weeks of school, you should provide yourself an extra 15 minutes on your drive to school. Giving yourself the extra time will allow you to drop off your student(s) on time and allow everyone to work through the drop-off and parking process appropriately.

Lastly, dropping your student(s) off on campus and having them walk into the building at 7:35 will be considered tardy as it has been in years past. Students must be in their first-period class to be considered on time.




STUDENT PARKING: CRITICAL INFORMATION FOR 2025-261




For the 2025-2026 school year, Southern Lehigh High School will be continuing with the same parking procedure as the 2024-2025 school year. Based on our set traffic flow and parent drop-off loops, students who received a parking spot **numbered 001 through 152** will be parking in the <u>Soccer Lot</u>. All students parking in the <u>Soccer Lot</u> must enter from Route 309. All students who received a parking spot numbered **206 through 268** and **337 through 381** will be parking by the tennis courts or the shed lot. Students must enter the school campus from Preston Lane.

Students cannot enter from Route 309 and cut through the lots to park by the tennis courts or the shed lot, and vice versa. Students who violate the traffic patterns are subject to the disciplinary action described in the student handbook. For the first 2 to 3 weeks of school, you should provide yourself an extra 15 minutes on your drive to school. Giving yourself the extra time will allow you to be in the building on time and allow everyone to work through the drop-off and parking process appropriately.



Students who received a parking spot number 400 through 426 will be parking at Southern Lehigh Middle School. Parking in an unmarked spot or in an assigned spot without properly displaying the parking permit may result in violations and penalties, including the possibility of the vehicle being towed at the owner's expense.



MAP 1 - PARKING IN THE MORNING


The second map illustrates the approved walking path that students must follow each morning to enter the school building. Given the high traffic volume at both the middle school and high school, this designated path provides the safest route for students and features the only marked crosswalk connecting the two campuses.

Students must follow the yellow path and use the designated pathways, crosswalks, and sidewalks offered by the school and the township.

The third and final map outlines the designated exit pathways that students must follow when leaving the SLMS parking lot. Due to the crossover of district busses picking up middle school students, it is imperative that students who drive and park at the middle school follow these exit procedures. Failure to adhere to the highlighted and arrowed routes may result in parking violations and corresponding consequences. Penalties can range from after-school detentions to the loss of parking privileges.



MAP 3 - EXIT PROCEDURES

It is the student's sole responsibility to be in first period by 7:35 AM. Students who arrive at either their high school campus parking spot or their middle school campus parking spot after 7:35 AM and cite the distance they are required to walk as the cause for their tardiness will be considered late. Furthermore, students who are observed by school personnel or captured on camera running across Preston Lane rather than using the designated crosswalk will be subject to disciplinary action for creating a safety hazard. Consequences may range from after-school detentions to the loss of parking privileges.

Finally, please understand that we will do the best we can in fulfilling every parking spot request we receive through the school year. However, due to the physical limitations of our campuses, spaces are limited. We currently have fewer parking spaces than students in the senior and junior classes. For this reason, underclassmen should not count on obtaining a parking permit unless it is directly related to their educational program.

COUNSELING OFFICE ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Schedules will be released on August 18th in Infinite Campus. If students have a question about their schedule, they should email their guidance counselor.

SLHS is very fortunate to have a wealth of support to offer our students. We have partnered with St. Luke's for mental health services, as well as our own SAP (Student Assistance Program), to help our students who may be struggling with any issues. Students or their families should reach out to their school counselor for assistance.

NURSE'S OFFICE

Incoming 11th graders: Physical exam required for 11th grade students 2025-2026 school year.

School Health Law requires medical examinations for all children in 11th grade. The Private Physician's Report is attached for your primary care provider to complete. It is recommended that this exam be done after May 1, prior to the grade it is required. However, if your child has had a physical exam completed after July 1, 2024 this will also be accepted. The forms can either be mailed or dropped off at the school, brought in on the 1st day, emailed to ILASIM@SLSD.org or have your physician fax the completed form to (610) 984-1638.

Incoming 12th graders: 2nd Meningitis immunization for 12th grade students 2025-2026

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania requires that any student entering 12th grade needs to receive the 2 nd Meningitis (MCV) immunization PRIOR to the start of the school year. If your child does not have proper documentation, they are at risk of exclusion from school. If your child has already received the immunization, please provide documentation to the nurse via email (ilasiM@SLSD.org), fax (610-984-1638), regular mail, or drop off at the front desk.



REPORTING ABSENCES

ATTENDANCE & PARTICIPATION IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For the 2024-2025 school year and beyond, the student handbook has been updated that all students in athletic or extracurricular activities must be here by 9 AM or will be declared inactive. These attendance protocols are for any individual involved in winter sports (basketball, wrestling, swim & dive, etc.) as well as all school sponsored extracurricular activities (upcoming Spring Musical, Speech & Debate, Robotics, etc). Below is the official language from the handbook:

1. In order for a student to participate in any athletic or extracurricular activity, including practice, they must be in attendance at school before 9:00 AM on the day of the activity. Pre-approved educational trips, college visits, and funerals are exceptions to this rule. A student who is absent from school may attend an activity as a spectator if the activity is open to the public.

As this is an update from previous years, I wanted to make sure all families and students are aware so that they may enjoy full participation in events. If there are any questions please do not hesitate to reach out to the high school administration.

WORKING PAPER PROTOCOLS

To Obtain a Working Permit at Southern Lehigh School District:

- 1. You must reside in the Southern Lehigh School District in order to have Southern Lehigh complete your working papers.
- 2. Download and complete the work permit application (<u>CLICK HERE</u>). Fill it out completely, including your parents' signature.
 - a. For 'Place of birth,' please list the City, State, and name of the hospital.
- 3. Email the completed application along with a copy of your birth certificate, passport, or driver's license to Ms. Burno at HSMainOffice@slsd.org.
- 4. You may pick up your work permit at the front desk of the high school during regular business hours.

OR

5. Bring your documents to the High School to complete your application in person. The office is available for working papers from 8 am-3 pm. Please check the high school calendar for holiday/school closures. During the summer, check the website or call ahead as our hours may vary.

Work permits are provided as a wallet-sized blue piece of paper. This must stay with the student until they reach the age of 18.

DO NOT give your employer the original work permit; only copies. Only one work permit will be issued per student.

SLHS VISITOR PROTOCOL

Please be advised that the following protocol will be followed when visitors enter SLHS. Visitors will only enter through the main entrance.

- Visitors will identify themselves and must provide a picture ID for verification.
- Visitors will state their intended destination in the building.
- The HS Greeter will call to confirm the appointment and get approval for any unexpected visitor. If the visit is unapproved or the recipient is unavailable. The visitor will be asked to call to make an appointment and return another time. The visitor will not be permitted to enter the building.
- If approved, the visitor will be issued a visitor's badge that must be worn in the building.
- When the visit is complete, the visitor will proceed directly to the main entrance without making any other stops, return the visitor's badge, and exit the building.


