Title: Written in Times New Roman, size 14, with Capital Letters at the Beginning of Each Main Word

Name of Author 1¹, Name of Author 2² — Times New Roman, size 12.

¹ Author affiliation must be written clearly with the country of origin in Times New Roman, size 10, spacing 1.15.

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Abstract: It must consist of one paragraph with a maximum of 200 words, spacing 1.15. The abstract should be concise and clear, allowing readers to understand new or important aspects of the study without reading the entire paper. The abstract follows the IMRAD structure: Introduction, Method, Result, and Discussion.

Select 3–5 keywords, arranged alphabetically, that help indexation. Keywords are placed on the same page as the abstract.

INTRODUCTION

Text is written in Times New Roman, size 12, spacing 1.15. Do not use non-standard abbreviations. Units must be stated and written in the metric system (meter, kilogram, or liter) following the International System of Units (SI).

All references, figures, and tables cited from sources must be numbered in superscript according to the Vancouver style.

The manuscript should be a maximum of 10 pages, on letter-sized paper, with margins of 2.55 cm on all sides (top, bottom, left, and right).

METHOD

The method section is written in Times New Roman, size 12, spacing 1.15. It JURNAL IMPLEMENTA HUSADA

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should describe in detail the research methods and procedures used in the article. Tables must be written in Arial Narrow, size 10, single spacing. Tables are numbered sequentially according to their order of appearance in the text. Each table should have a short title, and each column should have concise headings or subheadings. Explanations should be provided in footnotes, not in the title. Define all non-standard abbreviations in the footnotes. A maximum of six tables is allowed.

Statistical methods must be described in detail and supported by references. Any uncommon methods should be explained clearly with citations.

RESULTS

Figures or photos should be placed separately in the appendix. Figures must be numbered according to their appearance in the text. Each figure must have a label below it that includes the figure number, author's name, and any reference marks, written in Arial Narrow, size 10.

Identifiable photographs must include written permission. Previously published figures must have written consent from the source. The maximum number of figures or photos is six.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Acknowledgments may be given to research contributors (without academic titles). They should be directed to professionals who contributed to the preparation of the journal, including those providing technical support, financial assistance, or institutional support.

REFERENCES

References must follow the Vancouver style and Mendeley reference manager is mandatory. References are numbered sequentially based on their appearance in the article, not alphabetically. List up to six

authors; if there are more, write the first six followed by et al. A minimum of 20 references is required, with at least 80% from journal articles published in the last five years. Unpublished observations should only be cited with permission. Papers accepted but not yet published should be cited as "in press." Avoid citing personal communications unless absolutely necessary.
