HOW TO KEEP IT EASY & FUN

- 1. **Choose a Battle book**: Purchase it online, check it out from the library (the school will have some available), or get an audiobook or kindle version.
- 2. **Read the first chapter out loud** with your child so they can get a feel for the book and learn how to pronounce character names.
- 3. Ask your child **to give you an update** about the book they're reading while you're driving or eating dinner.
- 4. Form a parent-child book club. Have two bookmarks in the book. Once a child has read a portion, have them mark their place and put the book on a parent bedside table. The parent can then read and place in their own bookmark where they stop. Continue passing the book back and forth and discuss the book often until you finish it together.
