Standing in the van	Staff	- Lifting equipment to the back of the van in a vulnerable position.	 Manual handling principles must be adhered to. Kneel down and prevent twisting of the body.
Raft Build Barrels	Staff & Clients	- Moving up the stairs & beach	 Manual handling principles must be adhered to. Use multiple people to lift barrels. Prevent hyperextension by leaning backwards.
