a layover in Houston, Texas, where we will be playing lots of games to pass time and making sure that people get in their body weight workout from Erin, the Clark Trainer!




Here is a picture of a few of us on the bus bright and early this morning :)

Rising seniors Emma and Loren are taking a break from their "Spit" card game battle! (One of my favorite card games to play)








Rising junior and sophomore Rachel and Kelsey are waiting to board our next flight!



While at the volcano, we learned a ton about the history and location. The national park has two main craters but also a "secret" third one that has been completely covered by sand and we were able to walk on it. At the viewing point at the very top, you can see both coasts of Costa Rica when






Our second stop was to see some crocodiles in this river! The water is a brownish color due to the heavy rain in the mountains.









Team photo with the Costa Rican National Team! We took the dub 3-0 with goals by Morgan (2) and Alison!




Got to stop and see a sunset in Quepos before dinner!







Our bus driver Jose made a new friend with the kitty!






Treats from the Costa Rican National Team. These were SO delicious!




Mo sharing her drip drop with Jose.

Next we decided to end the afternoon by the pool!




We got some yummy pineapple smoothies, fully embracing the vacation spirit.

Jenna got a pizza, except she wasn't the only one who got to eat it...




And apparently they like smoothies too!


## Pura Vida!!!!

## Day 5



Jenna and I went kayaking around the boat, and captain Morgan steered us safely to our destination.






Morgan and Rachel tried snorkeling, but unfortunately the water was too cloudy to see due to some inclement weather. They looked cool trying though!

We stopped first at the Playa Hermosa-Punta Mala Wildlife Refuge to complete our second give back, cleaning up the beach where we saw turtle eggs!






Next we hopped back on the bus and stopped at a local restaurant to grab some lunch! I had a chicken quesadilla that was delicious!
