ABSTRACT

Your paper should begin with an abstract of about 150-250 words. The abstract should concisely inform the reader of the manuscript's objectives, methods and/or approaches, and findings. The paragraph starting with one tab, Times New Roman 11, single space.

Keywords: keywords are selected based on the word that best describes the contents of the manuscript (maximum 5 words). Keywords have to sorted alphabetically, Times New Roman 11.

1. INTRODUCTION

Manuscripts are written in 8-12 pages in two columns (except title, affiliation, and abstract) with one tab at the beginning of each paragraph. Use single space, A4 paper (21 x 29.7 cm), justify, and standard margins 3-3-2-2 (top-left-bottom-right).

The INTRODUCTION section consists of background, problem identification, objectives, and theory or references (the last 10 years).

2. RESEARCH METHOD

The RESEARCH METHOD section describes the type of data, data sources, sample/population, and research methods (or approaches).

3. RESULTS

The results are presented in full, clear, and interpreted according to the findings. In this section, it's possible to load sub-chapters with a format without a sequence of numbers or letters (lowercase and bold).

The mathematical equations are written in two tabs, Times New Roman 11, and italic.

If the the equation is more than one than numbers must be given in sequence.

$$Y = \alpha + \beta_1 X_1 + \beta_2 X_2 + e \quad (1)$$

$$Z = \alpha + \beta_1 Y_1 + \beta_2 Y_2 + e \quad (2)$$

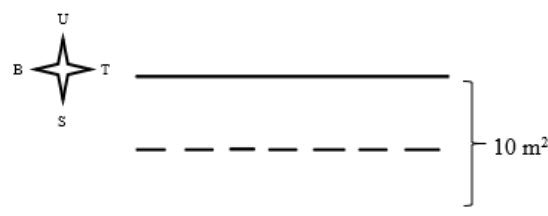


Figure 1. Title.....

Meanwhile, the format of figures and tables must be given a clear number and title, and referred to in it. For example, Figure 1, Figure 2 (a), Table 1, Table 2 (a). Each figure title is written below on the table in the left aligned format. Each figure and table must be given a source information, Times New Roman 10. The size of the information in the table is written in Times New Roman 10. If the table is truncated, the part of the table must be given a title of the table.
