Al Walker: Chicago Sustainability Network

Accelerate 77: accelerate growth in 77 communities, based on the assets in the communities

Partners with the Garfield Park Community Council (GF Conservatory Alliance)

Grow Garfield Park thru the natural + nature spaces

"Nourish Community" Events - invite specific residents, leaders, constituents - to discuss particular issues. Housing + Access to housing. These interactions lead to membership growth. Presentations use Technology of Participation - all facilitators are trained in. What is it about this particular community that you see as the asset(s) that will make this community stronger?

Working groups within CSLM (ex. Advisory team). Recycling, access to transportation, business development, access to jobs or sources that create jobs, etc. would be taken to City officials. Sustainability in Garfield Park is development on a community-friendly scale. Developers are of people who are not concerned with long-term neighborhood investment. Innovative business ideas coming out of Garfield Park - how to grow and sustain these, for the neighborhood's growth and sustainment?

Westside Bee Boyz

Teaches beekeeping in the whole process from care to harvest. Expanding programs from beekeeping, gardening, woodworking, etc. to educational classes, building on ideas continually

Westide BeeBoyz: STEAM program

Works with youth, has a sponsor organization.

ABCD approach: how do you sustainably grow a community? Asset-based community development

A community has no needs - a community has assets. Develop the framework for community to sustain itself.

Inspiration Kitchen

Background of difficulty navigating + re-entering the workforce, put through training, and then given jobs

Is Garfield Park Advisory Council focused on the park itself or the neighborhood area? GPCC: sponsors and is supportive of anyone wanting to create their own gardens. Youth summer programs through the One Summer Chicago (14-19 y/o). Both works with the Parks district + with the residents.

What's happening in your ward? How engaged are the people we're talking with activity in their neighborhood. Are residents tuned in with neighborhood activity? The question invites people to indicate how engaged they are.

How do you categorize an asset so a community pull those resources together into a strategy? Levels of interest. Big one is safety. Activity that doesn't feel like residents are able to engage with. Police intervention, not safety.
