7. New Business:
 - a. **Board Development Board Development - Assessment Update:** The Administration is continuing to innovate practices around how we assess/test students. “Making Learning Visible” fosters deeper understanding, collaboration, and student ownership of learning. When teachers and students make thinking, processes, and progress visible through documentation, reflection, and discussion, learning becomes a shared, dynamic experience. Students gain confidence as they see their growth and understand how they learn best, while teachers can better tailor instruction to meet individual needs. This practice also strengthens the classroom community—encouraging dialogue, curiosity, and respect for diverse perspectives—ultimately transforming classrooms into vibrant learning communities where every learner’s voice and progress matter. Making Learning Visible is a practice that prioritizes “skills” over “content knowledge.” With shared priorities listed in the Necedah Graduate Profile, this strategy amplifies ways in which we teach and monitor skills needed in the real world, beyond the academic standards. This was the topic of our Visioning Session on November 7th, and we have a plan for a 30-Day Challenge for teachers. There was shared energy to continue down this pathway of learning and exploration. A Shift to Student Led Learning is a change in course that puts student responsibility at the forefront of learning. Middle school is embarking on this powerful innovation to more deeply engage students

 - b. **Budget Forecasting FY 2027 and Beyond:** Brian Brewer, Baird Financial Advisor, attended the school board meeting and shared information and various scenarios regarding our financial forecast. This

information informed the school board on strategies for addressing a looming \$1.4 million shortfall in 2026-27. Tanya met with him on Thursday at the finance workshop. A referendum is necessary to avoid going into a negative balance.

Special board meeting will be December 1st, 2025, to go over the needs to figure out what the future operational referendum for the regular board meeting that will occur December 15th, 2025.
