

The future is of concern to everyone. Except Arabic students because it's so easy!

Technically there isn't a future tense in Arabic - all you have to do is add a single word or letter to any present tense verb you want to put in the future. It just depends on how formal you want to be and what dialect you're using.

In **فصحى**, simply add a **سـ** to the verb you want to put in the future.

I will learn	سأتعلم
You will learn	ستتعلم
They will learn	سيتعلمون

If you want to be extra fancy, use the word **سوف** instead of just a **سـ** (the **سـ** is short for **سوف**)

I will learn	سوف أتعلم
You will learn	سوف تتعلم
They will learn	سوف يتعلمون

In **مصري** a **حـ** or **هـ** is used

I will learn	حاتعلم
You will learn	حتتعلم
They will learn	حيتعلموا

In **شامي** a **راح** or **رح** in front of the word is used

I will learn	راح أتعلم
You will learn	راح تتعلم
They will learn	راح يتعلموا

In some other Gulf dialects, a **ع/عا** or **ع** in front of the word is used (sometimes it attaches directly to the word and sometimes it does not - it's a matter of regional dialect and personal preference)

I will learn	عا أتعلّم
You will learn	ع تتعلّمي
They will learn	ع يتعلّموا
