Poetry Assessment Task Activities

Choose ONE of the following options to help you with your English poetry assessment. There are 3 options depending on where you are up to.

OPTION 1: I'm having trouble getting started!

STEP 1: BRAINSTORM IDEAS

In the box below, brainstorm some common environmental issues/topics that are common in today's society. You may use the Internet to research this.

STEP 2: POETIC TECHNIQUES

List some poetic techniques that you are familiar with and are comfortable with using in your poem. Write some examples of these techniques based on the environmental issue that you chose above.

Technique	Example
Personification	The trees trembled in terror as the chainsaw attacked (deforestation)

STEP 3: WRITING YOUR POEM

- Before you start writing your poem:
 - Remember that your poem needs to be 70-100 words

- Remember that you should have approximately 4-6 stanzas (1 stanza per slide)
- Remember that a stanza is usually around 4-5 lines long

• While you are writing your poem:

- Have a main message in mind that you want to express in your poem and always refer back to this main message
- Think about what kind of images you want to use to represent your poem

EXAMPLE:

Main Message	Technique	Image
DEFORESTATION - Trees are being destroyed everyday. We forget that trees are living things as well and they deserve to be taken care of because they help the planet	The trees trembled in terror as the chainsaw attacked (Personification)

STEP 2: CHECKLIST

Make sure you have completed the following:

VISUAL REPRESENTATION	Completed? (Yes or No)
- My visual representation uses the Google Slides template posted on the Year 8 English Google Classroom	
- I have chosen appropriate images in my visual representation that reflect the main message of my poem	
- My visual representation incorporates the words of the poem on each slide with the images	
- There is one slide per stanza in my visual representation	
- My visual representation is 4-6 slides in length	

REFLECTION	Completed? (Yes or No)
- My reflection is 300-400 words	
- I have explained the main message of my poem	
- I have explained how I have used poetic techniques to get my message across to the audience	
- I have given examples from my own poem to support my response	
- I have explained my choice of images in my visual representation	
- I have explained how the images connect to the words and ideas of my poem	
- I have proofread all my work for any spelling, punctuation or grammar mistakes	
- I have asked a peer, teacher or parent to read my poem and my reflection and I have received feedback
