## **MSD Reforestation Grant for Streets/Neighborhoods**

# TreesLouisville will apply for the MSD reforestation grant on behalf of your street/neighborhood with the goal of planting a minimum of 25 trees.

Neighbors will be responsible for securing the tree planting locations by canvassing residents, with a goal of having at least 85% of the trees be larger than a Type C tree (see below).

Trees may be planted in rights-of-way or in a yard; neighbors must adhere to Metro's Urban Forestry Standards when planting in rights-of-way.

Rights-of-Way trees may require hiring a contractor to assist in planting due to their larger size. <a href="https://louisvilleky.gov/parks/document/parks-urban-forestry-standards-2022">https://louisvilleky.gov/parks/document/parks-urban-forestry-standards-2022</a>

- Type C Trees: trees that grow no more than 25 feet tall (examples: redbud, dogwood, fringe)
- **Type B Trees**: trees that range between 25-50 feet (examples: hornbeam, blackgum, yellowwood)
- **Type A Trees**: trees over 50 feet (examples: oaks, honeylocust, linden, most maples)

TreesLouisville will provide you with a list of trees that can be planted (roughly 2 of each type size) with a maximum number of how many of each tree we have. For example, we can offer

5 redbuds and 5 serviceberries for the C tree option and 8 blackgums and 8 hophornbeams for the B tree option..

Neighbors will need to collect the data as to where the trees will go so that we can use the data to complete the MSD grant. For example: 123 Story Ave - 1 redbud in right of way plus 1 blackgum in front yard.

Trees will be ready for planting sometime between November-January. Trees, greenwell watering devices, and delivery (to a central location in the neighborhood) will be included with the MSD grant.

Neighbors will be responsible for planting their individual trees & purchasing mulch + stakes unless additional funds from the neighborhood are raised to contract TreesLouisville to plant. The additional cost will depend on the size of the tree, but roughly \$50- \$75 per tree to plant, mulch, and stake unless it is a ball and burlap tree, which will be closer to \$150 (we will need bigger equipment to handle).

Neighbors will be responsible for watering and future care of all trees planted.

#### **Helpful Tips**

**Consider** working with your neighborhood association, which may have additional funding or other ways to support you in this project.

**Ask** recipients to pay \$X amount to help cover the cost of TL planting

**Create flyers** or online documents with details about each tree and "right tree right place" so that participants understand their options and can make a tree selection that is right for their home.

**If working with a larger neighborhood**, consider selecting certain streets or blocks to canvas to avoid having to move and plant over a large area.

#### **Timeline**

ASAP: You want to apply for the grant and feel confident that you can reach a minimum of 25 trees

August 1: Grant application due

August - October: You can canvass in your neighborhood

**October 31:** TreesLouisville needs to know how many trees you have "purchased" so they can be reserved for your neighbors **November 15 and beyond:** The neighborhood can schedule a planting date (If hiring TreesLouisville to contract, we may have input as to our availability. We also encourage neighbors to assist in recruiting volunteers to plant.)
