First Sunday of Advent - November 30, 2025

"Therefore, stay awake! For you do not know on which day your Lord will come."
(Matthew 24:42)

God calls us to be vigilant, ready to respond to His invitation. Could He be stirring your heart toward priesthood or consecrated life, to serve His Church with unwavering dedication? Second Sunday of Advent - December 7, 2025
