Why did Ade Coker die?

Ade Coker was blown up when he opened the package - a package everybody would have known was from the Head of State even if his wife Yewande had not said that Ade Coker looked at the envelope and said "It has the State House seal" before he opened it. (206)

He was saying that Big Oga's assistant - Ade Coker referred to the head of state as Big Oga even in his editorials - had called to say that Big Oga even in his editorials - had called to say that Big Oga was willing to give him an exclusive interview. (199)

When we got the next edition of the Standard, I knew it would have Nwankiti Ogechi on its cover. The story was detailed, angry, full of quotes from someone called The Source. Soldiers shot Nwankiti Ogechi in a bush in Minna. And then they poured acid on his body to melt his flesh off his bones, to kill him even when he was already dead. (200-201)

“This cannot go on, *nwunye m*,” Aunty Ifeoma said. “When a house is on fire, you run out before the roof collapses on your head.”

“It has never happened like this before. He has never punished her like this before,” Mama said.

“Kambili will come to Nsukka when she leaves the hospital.”

“Eugene will not agree.”

“I will tell him. Our father is dead, so there is no threatening heathens in my house. I want Kambili and Jaja to stay with us, at least until Easter. Pack your things and come to Nsukka. It will be easier for you to leave when they are not there” (Adichie 213-214).

What is one lie that Kambili tells while she is in the hospital? Why might Kambili lie about that?

She knew, for example, that I could move more body parts than I told the doctor, although she said nothing. Even the hot pain in my side had become lukewarm, the throbbing in my head had lessened. But I told the doctor it was as bad as before and I screamed when he tried to feel my side. I did not want to leave the hospital. I did not want to go home. (Adichie 215)

My class girls visited me that afternoon, their eyes wide with awed admiration. They had heard I had survived an accident. They hoped I would come back with a cast that they could all scribble their signatures on. (Adichie 215)

As Father Amadi trains boys for the local government high-jump championships, Kambili reflects that one difference between her and Jaja and their cousins. How were Jaja and Kambili raised differently than their cousins? Which way is better for you, personally? Why?

It was what Aunty Ifeoma did to my cousins, I realized then, setting higher and higher jumps for them in the way she talked to them, in what she expected of them. She did it all the time believing they would scale the rod. And they did. It was different for Jaja and me. We did not scale the rod because we believed we could, we scaled it because we were terrified that we couldn't. (Adichie 226)

In 1992, Col. Rindam, a military officer from Plateau State met his death at the hands of police operatives at a check point in Lagos. Upon discovery of that, the army took to the streets in Lagos in search of any policeman. As a result, policemen abandoned the streets in Lagos and withdrew to barracks. Robbers then had a field day in Lagos, operating with impunity. It took two weeks of talks before the military and police authorities succeeded in convincing the army chaps to return to barracks and for the police to come back to the roads. By that time, it was too late. Armed robbers were in control in Lagos and the like of Shina Rambo could not be challenged by any force.
