MAJOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO TEACHING IMPROVEMENT

The Friday Footnote. Every Friday a brief historical composition focusing on historical aspects of agricultural education is distributed via listserv to agriculture teachers across the United States. These Footnotes are designed to give teachers additional information (often not well known) about content they typically teach or could teach. PowerPoint presentations and teaching tips often accompany the Footnotes. Many universities and states forward these Friday Footnote teaching aids to their students and teachers. College of Agriculture and Life Sciences (CALS) Teaching Effectiveness Workshops: In the 1990s North Carolina State University contracted with two individuals to conduct multi-day teaching effectiveness workshops in each College at the University. The plan was to identify an outstanding workshop participant in each college and have that individual then assume the leadership for future teaching effectiveness workshops in the college.

Gary Moore was the individual in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences who was selected to provide the leadership for the CALS teaching effectiveness workshop. The workshop is primarily for recently hired faculty members or for faculty who are “encouraged” to attend by their Department Heads. There are typically around 20 participants in the workshop. It is sponsored by the Academic Dean for the College and the CALS Teaching and Advising Effectiveness Committee.

Dr. Moore planned the research-based agenda and enlisted the aid of outstanding teachers across the College to assist with the workshop. Many of the “graduates” have won teaching awards. The mean rating of the workshop during Gary’s tenure as director was a 4.8 on a 5.0 scale. Dr. Moore provided the leadership for this annual teaching improvement activity in CALS for ten years before handing it off to his colleagues. This workshop has made a major impact of improving teaching in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and continues to this day.

University of Illinois – United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Teaching Effectiveness Study. Drs. Anna Ball and Neil Knobloch at the University of Illinois received a High Education Challenge Grant from the USDA in 2004 to improve the collegiate level teaching of agriculture in the United States. The first phase of their project was to identify and study “exemplary” college professors across the United States.

Each agricultural college in the U.S. could nominate one professor to be in the study. Gary Moore was the nominee from NCSU. From this pool of nominees 12 professors were selected to be “under the microscope” for a two year period. Dr. Moore was one of those selected.

Over the following two year period the researchers collected course syllabi, copies of examinations, teaching philosophies, class materials, various personality and teaching inventories (from both the teachers and students) and conducted in-depth interviews with the twelve professors involved in the study and their students.

The findings of what makes an outstanding teacher were then disseminated to Colleges of Agriculture across the nation and made available to the public. If professors want to improve their teaching, they can learn from this research.

Ag*Idea Agricultural Education Collaborative. Across the nation Departments of Agricultural Education are among the smaller departments faculty wise. This presents a challenge, especially as it relates to graduate education as some universities do not have the necessary faculty to offer quality graduate programs.

To address this problem Dr. Moore along with NCSU’s John Havlin and colleagues from the University of Georgia and Auburn University wrote a successful \$464,481 grant titled Development of a Distance Education Consortium among the Southern Universities that was funded by the USDA (2007-2010). The proposal focused on developing collaborative graduate programs in Agricultural Education and Poultry Science.

Gary Moore was responsible for developing the Agricultural Education consortium. As he worked on this undertaking a number of universities outside of the south indicated they wanted to be involved; so the scope of the project was expanded to be nationwide. There were initially nine universities in the Ag*Idea Agricultural Education consortium – University of Arkansas, California State University – Chico, Clemson University, Kansas State University, University of Missouri, Montana State University, North Carolina State University, Oklahoma State University, and Texas Tech University.

Students enroll in one of the nine universities and receive their Master’s degrees from that university but can take courses from any of the cooperating universities. NCSU graduate courses have been well received and have attracted more enrollees than courses offered by the other universities. Over time certain course offerings have risen to the top and some of the universities have stopped offering their own version of the course and have advised their students to take the course offered by another consortium member. This is true for one of the core courses taught by Dr. Moore (AEE 501 Foundations of Agricultural and Extension Education). During the fall semester his class roster typically includes students from Oklahoma State, Kansas State and the University of Missouri in addition to the NCSU students.

The poultry science consortium never materialized but the development of the Agricultural Education consortium served as an example for the establishment of consortia in Agricultural and Environmental Law, Agricultural Systems Management Technology, Animal Science, Bioenergy and Sustainable Technology, Food Safety and Defense, Grassland Management, Horticulture, Quantitative Genetics and Genomics, Soil, Water and

Environmental Science, and Swine Science. These programs all operate under the Ag*Idea umbrella.

LEAP (Licensure in Education for Agricultural Professionals). Agriculture, as either an academic, vocational or STEM subject, is taught in about 12,500 high schools across the country and has been taught in these schools since the passage of the Smith-Hughes Act in 1917. There are nearly 500 teachers of agriculture in North Carolina. For the past 40 years there has been a documented shortage of agriculture teachers, both in North Carolina and nationally.

Several national task forces have looked at the agricultural teacher shortage problem and have typically recommended that more high school graduates be recruited to go to college and study agricultural education. However, the teacher shortage continues. So this is not the solution.

Gary Moore came up with the idea about 15 years ago that we should be recruiting mid-career individuals with agricultural degrees who are ready for a career change to become agriculture teachers. Because of changing family situations and consolidation of agricultural companies, there are individuals with substantial experience (and maturity) who want to become agriculture teachers. However, these students are often place-bound and have job and family responsibilities that does not allow them to attend a university (often hundreds of miles away) full-time in pursuit of teacher certification.

Dr. Moore wrote a grant to develop an on-line agricultural teacher certification program known as LEAP (Licensure in Education for Agricultural Professionals). The first step was to identify and develop the online courses needed for teacher certification. NCSU faculty took the lead in developing the courses but involved faculty from other universities with the objective of insuring quality in the courses and obtaining national buy-in and recognition of the LEAP program. This was accomplished and now people from all across the country are enrolled in (or have completed) this program.

One of the characteristics of the program is the courses are specifically designed to help the prospective agriculture teacher teach in and operate a quality agricultural education program. Students do not receive “generic” education courses.

The LEAP program was recognized in 2004 by the American Distance Education Consortium as one of the top five distance education programs in America. Graduates of the program have won state and regional teaching awards and often serve in leadership positions in their states. While there is still a shortage of agriculture teachers, the LEAP program has made a dent in the shortage.

Online Textbook for College Teachers. Moore along with colleagues at Mississippi State and New Mexico State received funding from the USDA in 1995-96 to develop a World Wide Web Hypermedia Textbook for Improving Instruction in Agriculture. This textbook was designed for college instructors. Posters about this project received the 1st runner-up award for Outstanding Poster at the Southern Region, Western Region and National meetings of the American Association for Agricultural Education in 1997. Faculty involved in this endeavor were Matt Raven and Michael Newman (Mississippi State), Gary Moore and Jim Flowers (North Carolina State) and Bobby Torres (New Mexico State).

Keynote Presentations: Dr. Moore is in demand as a keynote speaker at conferences of high school and college teachers. His keynote presentations focus on how to be a better teacher. He has twice been the “Blue Ribbon” speaker for the North American Colleges of Teachers of Agriculture. The “Blue Ribbon” speaker is a member of the society that the other members want to hear speak about teaching. Moore is the only person who has been asked to speak twice.

The Chautauqua Institution in New York State celebrated their 150th anniversary in 2024. Gary was the wrap up speaker for the summer long celebration. His presentation was “Go Ye Into All The World: Stories of the Chautauqua Movement and its Legacy.”

The Southern Association of Agricultural Scientist was formed in 1899. On their 100th anniversary Gary Moore was the keynote speaker and spoke about the significant developments in agriculture during the past 100 years. He also spoke at the 100th Celebration of the Bumpers College of Agriculture at the University of Arkansas.

Being invited to speak to the Philadelphia Society for Promoting Agriculture is a distinct honor for anyone in agriculture. This society was created in 1785 and counted Ben Franklin as a member. Gary Moore spoke in June of 2016.

Mentorship. Whenever a new faculty member is hired in the Department of Agricultural and Extension Education that person is typically paired with Dr. Moore to team-teach at least one course. The two collaborate on the course syllabus and divide the lessons up. For every class period, both instructors are in the room with one being the lead teacher for the lesson; but the other person contributes. After each class (and often before the class) there is discussion about what will occur or has occurred in the class. During the semester the rookie faculty member learns a lot, in a low-key, unobtrusive subtle manner about the art and science of teaching from Dr. Moore.

RECOGNITION OF SCHOLARSHIP

The research paper “Student-to-Student Interaction in Distance Education Classes: What Do Graduate Students Want?” presented at the Southern Region meeting of the American Association for Agricultural Education in Atlanta on February 1, 2015 was one of five recognized with the Distinguished Manuscript Award. Gary Moore, Wendy Warner and David Jones were the authors.

The research paper “Expectations of Graduate Students Regarding Student-to-Student Interaction in Distance Education Classes” presented to the Association for Career and Technical Education Research in Nashville, TN on November 19, 2014 was selected as the outstanding research paper at the conference. Gary Moore, Wendy Warner and David Jones were the authors.

The research paper “Assessing the Agriculture Teacher Workforce in New England.” presented by doctoral advisee Cassie Uricchio to the American Association for Agricultural Education (May 17, 2012 in Asheville) was recognized as a Distinguished Paper. The five papers rated the highest by the reviewers are given this designation, regardless of whether the paper was written by a graduate student or faculty member. This year 128 papers were submitted for consideration to be presented and 60 were accepted (47% acceptance rate). This is one of the top 5 papers submitted.

The research paper “The Role of Rosenwald Schools in Agricultural Education for African Americans” presented by my student Becca Fisher to the American Association for Agricultural Education. (Asheville, NC, May 17, 2012) was recognized as a Distinguished Paper. The five papers rated the highest by the reviewers are given this designation, regardless of whether the paper was written by a graduate student or faculty member. This

year 128 papers were submitted for consideration to be presented and 60 were accepted (47% acceptance rate). This is one of the top 5 papers submitted.

The paper "Perceptions of Academically or Intellectually Gifted Students Towards Agricultural Education" presented by my Master's advisee Elizabeth Gray to the American Association for Agricultural Education, Southern Region (Feb. 7, 2012 in Birmingham) was selected as a Graduate Student Distinguished Paper. The top five graduate student papers are recognized with this designation.

The dissertation of my doctoral student, Dan Smith was published as "Factors Affecting the Global Mindedness of Extension Agents: Implications for Building Global Awareness of Extension Agents" in the Journal of International Agricultural and Extension Education. 17 (1), 59-67. This article was the runner-up for outstanding journal article for Volume 17 (2010).

A poster (New Competencies to Be Successful as an Extension Educator in Present Context) authored by Dona Lakai under the guidance of Jay Jayaratne, myself and Mark Kistler, was the runner-up for outstanding research poster at the American Association for Agricultural Education, Southern Region Conference in 2011. This was based on Dona's thesis.

An essay on the future of Southern Agriculture submitted by graduate student Katie Murray to the Future of Southern Agriculture student essay contest (sponsored by Sygenta and the Farm Press in 2009) was the runner-up essay. Katie received a \$4,000 cash prize for the essay. I was Katie's faculty advisor for the essay.

A research paper (Effects of an Introductory Agricultural Education Course on the Agricultural Literacy and Perceptions of Agriculture of Urban Students) authored by a graduate student (Riedel, J) under the guidance of Beth Wilson, Jim Flowers and myself was the outstanding graduate student paper presented to the Southern Agricultural Education Research Conference in 2007.

A research paper (Walking the Talk: Factors Related to the Motivation of Teachers to Conduct the SAE Component of the High School Agricultural Education Program) authored by me and Beth Wilson presented at the Southern Agricultural Education Research Conference in 2006 was the runner-up for the Outstanding Research Paper

Was selected to present the Distinguished Lecture at the annual meeting of the American Association for Teacher Education in Agriculture in 2005.

A paper/poster titled "Do Professors who Teach With Energy and Concern Give Their Students More Motivation?" written by NCSU undergraduate student, Kristina Vester was selected as the outstanding paper at the 2005 NCSU Undergraduate Teaching Symposium. I was one of two mentors who guided her research.

Invited to represent the Western Hemisphere at a conference on the Developments in and future of agricultural education in Asia, the Pacific, North America, Europe and the Netherlands: Insights from practice and research at Wageningen University in the Netherlands in March of 2004. Teaching Outside of the College Classroom – Taking Knowledge to the Public.

How many NCSU professors are repeat speakers at Chautauqua, serve as guest editors of the Tar Hill Junior Historian magazine, and are invited to speak to the Philadelphia Society for Promoting Agriculture? Not many but Gary Moore is one.

Dr. Moore's teaching expertise and knowledge of the history of agriculture extends beyond the college classroom. He has a national reputation as an authority on the development of agriculture in America. Because of this, he is in demand to share the knowledge that his students benefit from weekly with a much wider audience. Several examples follow.

The Chautauqua Institution in western New York State is an American cultural treasure since its inception in 1874. During the summer season there are approximately 7,500 people on the grounds in a typical day to listen to a variety of speakers and participate in artistic, musical and cultural activities. Where else could one go to hear Ken Burns, Roger Rosenblatt, Associate Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg and listen to the Mormon Tabernacle Choir? Having a speaker at Chautauqua to discuss agriculturally related topics is not common. Yet Gary Moore is the exception.

Moore's first appearance at Chautauqua was in 2011 and the theme for the week was "World Health." He spoke about the History and Evolution of the Outhouse as it relates to world health. He has been invited back to speak every year since then and has discussed a variety of agricultural topics.

The North Carolina Museum of History publishes the *Tar Heel Junior Historian* magazine twice yearly for students in grades 4-12. Each issue of the magazine has a theme and there is a "conceptual guest editor" to help identify articles and writers. The theme for the fall 2015 issue was "Agriculture: Then and Now." Gary Moore served as the conceptual guest editor for that issue and authored the lead article.

MAJOR SERVICE CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE PROFESSION

- Helping plan the 100th Anniversary Celebration of the Association for Career and Technical Education in 2026.
- Developed the idea and was the driving force in getting the National FFA Organization to establish the H. O. Sargent Award to recognize diversity efforts in agricultural education.
- Chaired the *Journal of the American Association of Teacher Educators in Agriculture* Editing-Managing Board and led the effort to change the name of the Journal to the *Journal of Agricultural Education*.
- Editor of the *Agricultural Education Magazine*. When the editorship was assumed the *Magazine* had steadily been losing money and had a steady decline in subscriptions. Both trends were reversed.

- As Historian of AAAE has collected 25 videotaped interviews of the leaders of the profession.
- Located the lost Stimson manuscript on early leaders in agricultural education.
- Met with the Southern Association of Agricultural Scientist (SAAS) board and attended their meetings to lay the groundwork for the merger of the Southern Agricultural Education Conference with SAAS.
- Initiated the National Quiz Bowl competition for collegiate agricultural education students.
- Developed and maintains the SAE Central web site which is a teaching resource for agriculture teachers across the country. SAE is Supervised Agricultural Experience.
- Promoted the development of a “research” SAE category through the development of a new SAE model.
- Chaired the National FFA Task Force on SAE. Instrumental in the development of an electronic “SAE Handbook” for use by agriculture teachers.
- Along with Dr. Wendy Warner has established an “online museum” of FFA artifacts
