

Interview clip transcript: Dawn Wright – about BaBi Wakefield

I was offered the opportunity to do the scoping report for BaBi Wakefield alongside the audit role - so that would have been in early '21.

Born and Bred in Wakefield is a part of Born in Bradford and they've extended their research to become a multisite study and it's looking at tackling health inequalities - which is something I'm really passionate about - and making a difference to all people and not just the people who usually put themselves forward for things, the well-educated, white British women, who tend to sort of volunteer for things.

I want to see a difference for all of our women, and we already know that women from the more underserved populations are the ones that have the worst outcomes, so actually part of my being here is trying to attract those women to come and join us as well so we understand what their needs are as well.
