49th ANNIVERSARY OF *ROE v. WADE* – **Bold for Abortion Justice** January 2022

Bold for Abortion Justice Messages

CORE MESSAGE: Abortion justice can't wait. It's time for bold action to build a future where abortion care is there for everyone who needs it, especially for people of color working to make ends meet.

VISION/VALUES

- We envision a world where abortion care is there when we need it, without barriers based on who you are, where you are from, or how much you earn.
 - Each of us should be able to live, work, and make decisions about our health and our future with dignity and respect.
 - When people can make decisions about their own reproductive health care, including whether and when to have children, they have more control over their economic security.
- Racism, economic insecurity, and immigration status multiply the already massive barriers to abortion care. So, our solutions must include racial, economic, and immigrant justice.

PROBLEM

- It's nearly 50 years since the Supreme Court guaranteed a legal right to abortion through *Roe v. Wade*, but that failed to ensure everyone can get abortion care, especially people of color working to make ends meet. Decades of abortion restrictions have denied them the ability to get the care they need when they need it.
 - For more than 45 years, the Hyde Amendment and related restrictions have banned federal insurance from covering abortion—including for anyone enrolled in Medicaid.
 - The impact? Forcing people seeking an abortion to carry an unwanted pregnancy to term, which falls hardest on people of color working to make ends meet, especially women of color.

- Restricting Medicaid coverage of abortion [forces one in four poor women](#) seeking an abortion to carry an unwanted pregnancy to term;
 - When a woman wants to get an abortion but is denied, she is more likely to be driven into years of economic hardship.
- Medication abortion care is safe and effective but overly restricted.
 - Anti-abortion politicians in [19 states](#) have banned the use of medication abortion care through telehealth. There is no medical or scientific reason for these bans—they are purely political.
- In the last 10 years, anti-abortion politicians have passed hundreds of laws that shut down clinics, force people to travel long distances, create additional expenses like hotel accommodations and child care, and sometimes delay care. [With more than 100 state restrictions enacted](#), 2021 was the worst year on record for attacks on abortion care.
- The impact of these massive barriers to abortion care is exacerbated by systemic racism, economic insecurity, and immigration status.
 - Undocumented immigrants in our country are being denied the basic human right to make the best health care decisions for themselves and their families, including abortion care, simply because of their immigration status.
 - The same people who are most harmed by abortion restrictions are also bearing the brunt of the pandemic and systemic racism every day.
- However we feel about abortion, politicians shouldn't be able to deny someone care just because of where they live or how much they earn.

SOLUTION

- Trump's appointments have tilted the Supreme Court squarely against abortion, making an already dire situation worse. But we--women, people of color, immigrants--know what it's like to fight impossible odds and we will be bold in our struggle for justice.
- People of color and young people are tired of bearing the brunt of court decisions that disenfranchise us and our decision-making. We are boldly taking a stand and leading a new Abortion Justice movement.
- We call for bold solutions that address the realities of getting an abortion in the United States and break down the barriers for people of color working to make ends meet when they seek care.
 - Our solutions must address racial, economic, and immigrant justice so that each of us, whoever we are, can get the care we need.
 - With the Action Plan for Abortion Justice, we call for abortion care in the communities where we live.
 - We call for solutions that put people who have abortions first, allowing care, especially medication abortion, to be provided in ways that are comfortable and make sense for them.
 - We call for an end to the unnecessary hurdles and stigma that people face when seeking abortion care.

- With the Action Plan for Abortion Justice, we call for abortion care that is covered by all public and private health insurance plans.
- We call for abortion care that immigrants can obtain without fearing deportation or detention.
