Part 1

1. Deal with the text

Activity 1

- Click [here](#). Run through the active vocab words for 30 sec.
- Read the text 'Eat to Relax' in pairs sentence by sentence
- Click [here](#) (page 2). Translate the R sentences into E. Use the list of words but try to avoid looking at the text itself

Activity 2

- Answer some questions left on Telegram or the questions below:

 - Can you give some examples from your own experience?
 - Do you agree with the facts given in the text?
- Retell the text. Use your plan and phrases of opinion
