Principal's Report and School Update

Sunita Sas reported about the current ongoings of the school.

- Thank you to School Council and parents for a successful book fair. Feedback from parents supports having a book fair during the Celebration of Learning.
- Thank you to the volunteers for the work that is going towards Healthy Hunger lunches.
- The grade 6 made a thank you card for the funds (\$200) that went towards a Royal Glenora field trip. The junior high has also allocated their funds to a junior high field trip,
- Parents can let teachers or the office know if they are interested in volunteering. See this
 info in the last family update.
- Welcome to new staff that is covering leaves in the school and covering in the office area.

- Pre-enrollment reminders have been going out to ensure that accurate planning for next year can occur. This has closed and the school is planning using these numbers. There are openings in K and 3 at this point other than students that are in the primary catchment area.
- April 17 to 21 is HLAT writing tasks from prompts for all grade 1 to 9 students. These are
 marked collaboratively to help teachers benchmark assessments and match level of
 assessment across classes and schools in the division. These are marked as teams on
 the April 28 PD day to ensure fair assessment across classes using the division
 exemplars.
- Feedback from parents was supportive around the Celebration of Learning event.
- There is a parent session available April 25 called 'Cyber World: What Happens When You Press Send' and has been shared on SchoolZone. It is from the Saffron Center through a virtual meeting link.
- Multi-cultural day is being organized on May 19, 10:15am-1:30pm.
- Grade 4 and 5 spring concert is upcoming May 18 with three options for times to attend.
 There is an option being considered to add Grades 1-3 students with a singing performance at the outdoor carnival.
- Parents are now able to enter attendance through SchoolZone and are encouraged to do so.

Completed Fundraising Update

- Healthy Hunger Charlene Cook reported that there have been two more with others added for families to order. This is going well.
- Scholastic Book Fair: -Georgina Ball reported that over \$11000 was sold with a large number of books ordered and delivered to teachers at the last staff meeting. Total rewards are around \$5700 with \$2000 remaining from last year. Teachers will be able to look through the rewards catalog. October 16-19, 2023 and March 18-22, 2024 have both been booked for the book fair next year. It went well but it was very difficult to find enough volunteers. Ideas were shared about how to advertise for more volunteers.

Upcoming Fundraisers

- Healthy Hunger Hot Lunch Program Charlene Cook reported there are upcoming hot lunches from new vendors. These have been advertised. Charlene Cook is booking 2 of Tim's, Pita Pit, and Pasta Pantry for the remainder of the school year. June 1 and 16 will be the last two dates.
- Spring Concert and Carnival Amanda and Shannon met and there is a list of activities
 that are being considered and confirmed as well as a plan for the layout. Thoughts were
 shared for the next committee meeting. A date for the next meeting will be sent out by
 Amanda Joblinski and Shannon Kornago.
- Spring Plant Sale and Bottle Drive Plant sale is going as planned. Charlene Cook has booked with the Windermere bottle depot for June 2 from 11am to 6pm. Advertising for this will need to occur alongside plant pick up and general advertising.
- Write-On Stationery Sunita Sas reported that teachers will confirm lists by May 1.
- Gift Cards Fundraiser Shannon Kornago reported that this is labor intensive and it has been canceled.

New Business

- Heritage Confections Charlene Cook found out that this is selling kettle popcorn. This
 company had reached out to offer this as a fundraiser. Tawana shared that Davidson
 Orchard was a good apple fundraiser. These will be tabled until the fall.
- Sports Tent Shannon Kornago reported that the cost of these has gone up. A number
 of members shared that they have seen more portable versions. If this is less than the
 \$1500 allotted, some PE equipment will be repurposed for recess and new equipment
 will be purchased with the balance. Motion by Shannon Kornago to give the PE
 department \$3000 over the next two years from AGLC funds for needed equipment.
 Shannon Kornago will look into this further for the May meeting and will liaison with the
 PE department..
- Board Insurance Insurance is needed to be completed. It is a requirement under the Societies Act. Tawana McLeod has sent the information to Amita Kohli to take care of the insurance.
