Meeting Minutes

Principal's Report: Garin B.

-Plans for next year's staffing were shared. Open positions have been posted and a couple new staff have been hired.

- Staff priorities to keep in mind include: class size, intervention support for split grade levels, mental health support, and to keep special programs like bridging.
- We had 25 classrooms this year, the plan is to have 24 classrooms next year. Many split classrooms but since adding the 3rd DLI Kinder classroom, hoping to decrease splits as they move up.
- New DLI Kinder teacher- Claudia Neu
- New DLI 1st grade teacher- Laura Youngquist, coming back to LC
- New DLI 2nd grade teacher- Teri Petrin
- A couple teachers moving to a different grade level or new role
- Preliminary class placement will begin on May 22. Enrollment will continue to be monitored over the summer and adjustments made as necessary.

-District/Building Announcements

- All students (except seniors) will keep technology, library books, and school materials throughout the summer.
- Report cards will be marked Not Evaluated (NE) for the 3rd trimester and teachers will make individualized written comments.
- Kinder and 6th grade graduations are being planned. Will be Online per MDE and MDH.
- 2020 fall planning: schools are being asked to put together plans for face to face learning, continued distance learning and plans for a hybrid of the two. Our district is doing well in planning/preparing for distance learning.
 - Question raised about a timeline of when we might know more about how school might look this fall. Kitty Goggins, school board member, stated per Gov. Walz, he did not think schools would be back full time this fall. Timeline is hard to pinpoint. Challenging decisions to be made and summer school is still being worked out.



 Summer planning is underway. Currently LC serves 15-20 students/day needing childcare and 150-200 families/day with food.

-56 staff cars participated in the Little Canada Parade!! A video with a link to the parade will be coming soon.

- -A big thanks to all the PTA board and members for all the help this year!
- -PTA had 4 goals going into the year in hopes to pass the baton equitably:



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- Maintain status quo of current programs/activities
- 2. Grow new programs, like Amity and Bridging
- 3. More communication
- 4. Increase participation and get more involvement, including ELI families
- **-Walk a Thon**: Will be an at home event this year, do it on your own. Hoping to get a warm up video from Ms. Johnson and an encouragement clip from Mr. Bogenholm. Will be raising funds using 99 pledges, money will be going towards next years funding.
- -Variety Show- Alisha B. is working on an online variety show
- -Club's Choice- We signed a 3 year contract, next year is our 3rd year. We get .20/item sold as a bonus. Our current bonus would be \$489. 27 students earned limo rides this year, hope to include them into next years rides. Are options for Club's choice next year. Possible change it to November and it could be done mostly online.
- -Student Directory- will be holding off on it for this year. A plan is in place for next year with hopes to get a directory out by MEA break.
- -Yearbook- did get published. Will be mailed out, probably on June 3rd.
- -Bridges: The school was able to cover the entire cost of Bridges this year, so the PTA is able to roll that money over to next year.
- -Amity:1 intern has been accepted for next year. She is from Madrid, Spain. Working on selecting a 2nd intern. So far 1 host family has been confirmed for next year.

Treasury Report- Mark

-Budgeted earnings for the year a little short, but we also spent less money due to the pandemic and no school events this spring. No celebration of nations, no school patrol party, able to keep our bridging \$ for next year. At the start of the year, we had around \$23,000. At the end of the year we have just over \$19,000 plus \$6500 specifically earmarked for Amity. Thanks Mark!
