- Transportation issues with weather were discussed, pertaining more to other areas of the board.
- Acknowledging the Provincial election being called and the influence that has on school board
- Let's Go! UGDSB Goals and key outcomes. End of 2nd Quarter and reflecting on the goals r/t reading and math. Financial challenges which was in the news r/t replacement cost for staff
- Superintendent retired and was not replaced for costs savings r/t budget challenges (replacement costs in 2019 just under 12 million now is 20 million and minimal increases in funding - 80% of budget is for staff salaries which already make it challenging for other costs)
- Healthy reserve UGDSB has with permission from MoE which they used for reading and math additional learning which has shown success.
- Working on attendance for all "Everyday Counts" initiative
- Centre Wellington K-8 on track to open Sept 2025
- Out of district change: open/closed schools Policy 521 reminder of Jan 31st deadline and no transportation provided for those requesting.
- Policy 214 Accessibility Feb 13th feedback
- Pro Grant so far 44 applications: Mid Feb decisions will be made
- Questions about cyber security and John McCormic through the board is the contact, which came up r/t Pro Grant ideas at some of the schools

Food Program

Harvey's, Booster Juice and Zehrs Fruit Cups are going well. After an unsuccessful attempt to find a suitable Halal vendor, we have decided to run Wok Box and Booster Juice again in the March 20 to May 1 slot. We are adding additional options from Wok Box that include: Butter Chicken on Rice, Beef and Broccoli on Rice, Vegetable and Egg

Fried Rice and Gluten Free Sweet Tamari Chicken and Broccoli. Orders will open at the end of the month. Profits from the food program are ~\$13,200 and will likely surpass our fundraising goal from the program by a significant margin.

ProGrant Funding Application

Council, in partnership with the School, submitted an application for \$1000 of funding to support parent engagement with a specific focus on mental health and well-being. We will be informed in February whether the proposal was funded or not.

Staff Appreciation Lunch

A February date might be better for a winter event next year to avoid conflicting with high school exams, limiting the availability of high school students for volunteers and to allow more time between the winter break and any School Cash Online posting and possible financial asks.
