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Life of Pi Research Essay Requirements

1. Minimum of 9, completed research cards tracked on NoodleTools.
 - a. Life of Pi information will not count as research cards
 - b. At least three pieces of cited research from non-*Life of Pi* research sources in each body paragraph (paraphrase or summary)
 - c. At least three pieces of quoted or paraphrased evidence from *Life of Pi* in each body paragraph to pair with the cited research.
 - d. All sources tracked on NoodleTools
2. **Submission of thesis and one body paragraph for feedback by its due date or you might not receive feedback**
3. Printed rough draft
4. Printed final essay with a cover page and a works cited page
