Amy Jones, President opened the general membership meeting at 6:33. She welcomed all the guests and introduced Superintendent Cathy Moore.

WCPSS Superintendent, Cathy Moore welcomed the membership and thanked them for their service this year. She recognized that we all had high hopes for a routine opening. Teachers, school communities need PTA leaders as partners to provide encouragement and support during this difficult time. The top 2 priorities are 1) daily in person learning 2) highest safety possible.

WCPTA President, Amy Jones. Amy reminded everyone of the mission of the PTA. She shared the #1 priority of PTA is advocacy.

7:00 - 7:30 SESSION I - Restorative Practices for WCPSS

Speaker: Misti Southern

Restorative practices (RP) are a series of approaches and tools that build and strengthen relationships and connections within communities. Under the umbrella of Restorative Practice:

- Circle Processes
- Facilitated Dialogue/mediation
- Restorative responses - bring your best self within and outside of circles. Take the practice into the community.

There is a staff member in all areas of the district. Focus is on the Tier 1 work as opposed to just responding to crises. Everything in RP is an invitation and not a directive. When students feel connected they are more likely to perform better academically.

Last year the restorative team was also focused on helping teachers and staff to deepen connections and wellness practices to improve SEL. When teachers care better for themselves, they are more able to care for their students.

The team also offers Parent circles, Circle Awareness

The structure of Restorative Practices:

Tier 1 develop relationships

Tier 2 maintain relationships- mirror conflicts, conflict resolution

Tier 3 Repair relationships - conferencing and problem solving circles

Circle is a foundational piece of Restorative Practices

- Invitation for a structured dialogue process that is regulated through the use of a talking piece
- self-reflective, connecting with one another, importance of positive relationships is central to building community, all participants are respected and given equal opportunity to share
- SEL of participants is honored and valued

WCPSS data

- Active in 140 schools
- Proactive approach to discipline
- Lowered suspension rates
- Strengthened relationships

How can PTAs reach minority families? - Rosa Rangel

- Figure out who your families are, what languages do they speak, how they prefer to receive information
- How do families perceive family engagement? It means different things to different people. Just because a family doesn't volunteer to participate in PTA events doesn't mean they aren't engaged in their child's education.
- Be intentional
- Be equitable
- Explain what PTA is and the process associated
- Build relationships

Budget Best Practices - Gary Lewis

- Look at your past expenses
 - Operations and Programs
- Consider past income
- Get input from school leadership
- What are your plans for programming for the year
- Create fundraising goals to support the programming
- Explain to your membership what your plans are for programming and then ask for money to support those programs

Fundraising Suggestions - Amy Jones

- 1- Purpose - create your goals first
- 2- Fundraising is a means to an end
- 3- remember the 3:1 rule - programs to fundraising
- 4- if you are going to have rewards or incentives, use participation as criteria, not total amount

Advocacy - How to address controversial issues when you're school isn't
