What do you need to graduate from high school?

17 Compulsory Credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD):

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per Grade)*
- 3 credits in Mathematics (Grade 9, 10, and 11 or 12)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Technological Education (Grade 9 or 10)
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in the Arts**
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics and Citizenship

Plus one (1) credit from the following group:

STEM-RELATED COURSE GROUP

- business studies
- computer studies
- cooperative education
- mathematics (in addition to the 3 compulsory credits currently required)
- science (in addition to the 2 compulsory credits currently required)
- technological education (in addition to the 1 compulsory credit required)

In addition, students must complete:

- ✓ 4 religion credits (1 per Grade)
- ✓ 9 optional credits***
- ✓ 40 hours of community involvement activities
- ✓ Provincial literacy requirement (OSSLT or OSSLC)
- ✓ 2 online courses

Starting in September 2025, students must earn a new financial literacy graduation requirement as part of their compulsory Grade 10 Mathematics course. Students will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement and earn their high school diploma.

- * A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.
- * The Grade 11 English: Understanding Contemporary First Nations, Metis and Inuit Voices course may be used to meet the Grade 11 English compulsory credit requirement.
- ** The Grade 9 Visual Arts: Expressions of First Nations, Metis, and Inuit Cultures course may be used to meet the compulsory credit requirements in the Arts.
- *** Students may count a maximum of 4 optional credits towards the OSSD earned through approved college-delivered dual credit programs, if they are not also claiming credit for external (Music) credentials.

What do you need to graduate from high school?

18 Compulsory Credits

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD):

- 4 credits in English (1 credit per Grade)*
- 3 credits in Mathematics (Grade 9, 10, and 11 or 12)
- 3 credits from Group 1, 2 and 3 courses (1 from each)
- 2 credits in Science
- 1 credit in Canadian Geography (Grade 9)
- 1 credit in Canadian History (Grade 10)
- 1 credit in the Arts**
- 1 credit in Health and Physical Education
- 1 credit in French as a Second Language
- 0.5 credit in Career Studies
- 0.5 credit in Civics and Citizenship

Group Requirements:**GROUP 1**

Additional English; additional French as a Second Language***; FNMI Studies; a Classical, International or Native Language; Humanities; Social Science; Canadian and World Studies; Guidance and Career Education; Cooperative Education****

GROUP 2

Additional Health and Physical Education; additional Art; Business, additional French as a Second Language; Cooperative Education

GROUP 3

Science (Grade 11 or 12); Technological Education; Computer Studies; additional French as a Second Language***; Cooperative Education****

In addition, students must complete:

- ✓ 4 religion credits (1 per Grade)
- ✓ 8 optional credits****
- ✓ 40 hours of community involvement activities
- ✓ Provincial literacy requirement (OSSLT or OSSLC)
- ✓ 2 online courses

* A maximum of 3 credits in English as a second language (ESL) or English literacy development (ELD) may be counted towards the 4 compulsory credits in English, but the fourth must be a credit earned for a Grade 12 compulsory English course.

* The Grade 11 English: Understanding Contemporary First Nations, Metis and Inuit Voices course may be used to meet the Grade 11 English compulsory credit requirement.

** The Grade 9 Visual Arts: Expressions of First Nations, Metis, and Inuit Cultures course may be used to meet the compulsory credit requirements in the Arts.

*** A maximum of 2 FSL credits can count towards compulsory groups.

**** A maximum of 2 Cooperative Education credits can count towards compulsory credits.

***** Students may count a maximum of 4 optional credits towards the OSSD earned through approved college-delivered dual credit programs, if they are not also claiming credit for external (Music) credentials.

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
