**Protecting our Students:** Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, all North Carolina public school units are required to provide age-appropriate education on child abuse, neglect, and sexual abuse to students in grades 6 through 12 at the beginning of the school year. This action is mandated by Session Law 2023-128/House Bill 142, "Protect Our Students Act". The materials mandated by this law were not available at the beginning of the 2024-25 school year; therefore, under the terms of this statute, all school districts are to comply at the beginning of the 2025-26 school year.
