In all those sports I would go on to see players become all-stars in the pros or look back at past all-time greats that came from my school. All except basketball. In the 50 years since I've been a student, that hasn't changed.

Of the teams offering you Maryland has the fewest players drafted, the fewest first-round picks, and the fewest all-stars. Not only that, but in the 18 years you've been alive, a Maryland player in the NBL has not started a single game.

You might think a team with such little pro history will be lacking in history as a whole, but that's not true. Maryland has 4 Sweet 16s with one coming as recently as 2053 and had a stretch of 8 straight NT appearances with half of them being 4 seeds or higher. We're gaining steam now, bouncing back to the program's highest prestige level in over a decade.

Despite Maryland's lack of pros, as a coach, I have produced plenty myself. Cauthen at Georgetown only has one, and a 2nd round pick at that. Coach Ben at NC State doesn't have a single draft pick in the past 5 years. In the last draft, Cortez Sumler was selected with the 11th pick from Cincinnati who I had recruited and trained for 3 years. Before that, I've had 4 other players drafted. One of which is Martavius Williams who just signed a massive 144 million dollar contract. Another, Nick James, you probably recognize as he won a ring with your hometown Sixers. I know I can get you there. Now I want to do it for my fellow Terps so they can finally have that all-star to look up to.

Getting drafted isn't easy, but playing in the SEC will help. This conference isn't easy, but it will put you in the spotlight playing the best. Houston are the reigning champs, Georgia is a perennial force, Tennessee is a program on the rise to greatness, and Tulane has been an NT mainstay for the past 8 years. Not only do we have elite programs, but the coaches are also elite at bringing in and developing talent hence the SEC having the most 1st round picks in the last draft with 10.

We won't roll over to these teams either. Beating Houston in my first season was our best conference win in the past decade or more, and we've beaten upstart Tennessee in my first two seasons too. Coming into this season on an upward trajectory and ranked 20th in returning talent we are primed for a breakout.
