NORTH CAROLINA'S HB808:

A RESOURCE GUIDE FOR THE TRANS COMMUNITY

This guide will be updated as new information & resources are available.

What does HB808 say?

<u>HB808</u> prohibits the initiation of any gender-affirming care in NC for people under the age of 18, including puberty blockers, gender-affirming hormone therapy, and surgery. It does not restrict care that is already initiated – youth who have begun a "course of treatment" before August 1, 2023 can remain in care. It is recommended that you ask your provider about how they are interpreting this language.

The law does <u>not</u> say that people cannot leave North Carolina and access care in states where it is legal to do so, and a court would likely agree that it is unconstitutional to block people from traveling to other states. Youth can also continue to access mental health care, which is not restricted or banned by this law in North Carolina.

When does HB808 take effect?

HB808 is currently in effect. The North Carolina General Assembly passed HB808 in June of 2023, and it was then vetoed by the Governor. On August 16, 2023, the General Assembly voted to override the Governor's veto, making HB808 law.
