Travel Postcards!

Directions: You will travel around the world to visit and witness the beginning of one of the major religions/philosophies of the world. For whichever belief you are assigned, you will create a total of 2 (TWO) postcards explaining what you learned while on your trip. You can use the readings in your textbook, library databases and resources, as well as academic websites to gather the information. At least one of your resources must be from a printed book. The CCHS Library class project page has a list of approved resources.

Lastly, you need to have an illustration on the front of each postcard to show what you saw including color! You cannot use the symbol of the religion as your picture. You are showing places and things from the regions in which the religion is practiced. Think about the holidays they celebrate and the customs they have.

- 5. Share out in class on Sept. 8th

We will be in the library from Sept. 2nd-5th. Report to the library (lab A) each day. You can create your 2 postcards on large poster paper or electronically (GoogleSlides/Canva). We will start presenting on September **8th** and it is worth **20 points**.
