This is the culmination of what you believe about God and what you have learned throughout your Confirmation experience. Your expression can utilize any expression (song, dance, painting, essay, poetry, video, digital art, and more). Your expression should include the teachings you believe, who you are in Jesus Christ, how you relate to God, how you plan to be part of OSLC in the coming years, how you see people who don't know Jesus, and your Confirmation verse. This worksheet will help you process your thoughts with leading and reflective questions.

Start with choosing an expression. How do you enjoy communicating with people best? Do you have artistic talent? When you learn about your faith, what types of expressions communicate best with you?

What's your plan for being in Christian community in the coming years? Will worship with the church be part of your life? Are there adults or mentors you intend to invite to speak truth into your life?

Choose a Confirmation verse. A Confirmation verse is one that we memorize and remember for the rest of our lives. As you begin to choose a verse, pray that God would lead you in this search. When you choose a verse, read the surrounding chapters to understand the context and ensure it confirms the message you think it's saying. Remember, this is a verse that should provide you hope, encouragement, and guidance.
