

Junior Class College Specific Scholarship Awards

A student wishing to be nominated for one of these College/University specific awards should email Mrs. Hejaily in the LHS Counseling Center no later than two weeks prior to the nomination date indicated. In the subject line of the email please list the name of the scholarship and attach an activity resume to the email.

- **Alfred University Scholar Award** – Nominate by 3/1

This award is presented to a student who is “Outside of Ordinary”, who inspires others through their academics and extracurricular activities. The recipient will receive \$30,000 per year if enrolling at Alfred U. in Liberal Arts & Sciences, Business, Performing Arts, Mechanical, or Renewable Energy Engineering programs or \$18,000 per year if enrolling in the School of Art & Design, Biomaterials Engineering, Ceramic Engineering, Glass Engineering Science or Materials Science and Engineering programs.

- **Clarkson University Leadership Award** – Nominate by 3/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates outstanding leadership qualities and is recognized by faculty and students as having been a positive contributor to the school and community. This award automatically carries a \$100,000 (\$25,000 per year) tuition scholarship if the recipient chooses to enroll at Clarkson University.

- **Clarkson University Achievement Award** - Nominate by 3/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates leadership and outstanding academic achievement. This award automatically carries a \$80,000 (\$20,000 per year) tuition scholarship if the recipient chooses to enroll at Clarkson University.

- **Elmira College Key** – Nominate by 3/1

The Elmira Key is given based on academic merit and outstanding school and community leadership. Recipients of the Elmira Key receive a scholarship of \$80,000 (\$20,000 per year) upon enrolling at Elmira College.

- **Keuka College The George H. Ball Community Achievement Award** – Nominate by 3/1

Named after the founder of Keuka College, the Ball Award rewards students based on qualities that embody the values of Keuka College, including: integrity, academic excellence, diversity, leadership, service, and social responsibility. The award grants qualifying students an annual merit scholarship of at least \$22,000 per year of study at Keuka College.

- **Le Moyne Heights Award** – Nominate by 3/1

Recognizes outstanding juniors who are “reaching for the Heights” both in the classroom and in their communities. Recipients receive a Certificate of Recognition and an annual \$16,000 tuition scholarship to Le Moyne College.

- **Presbyterian College Fellows Award** – Nominate by 3/1

This scholarship recognizes high school juniors who have demonstrated potential for future success and met GPA, PSAT, and ranking criteria. The awardee is eligible to receive an annual scholarship of at least \$25,000 annually for four years of study at Presbyterian College.

- **Rachel Carson Chatham University Healthy Planet Award and Scholarship** – Nominate by 5/31

Chatham University offers the Rachel Carson Book Award for junior students who show leadership and passion for sustainability and the environment, social justice and policy studies, or an interest in writing and the sciences. This junior is receiving a copy of Carson's Silent Spring book as well as a \$2,500 merit scholarship to Chatham University in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, should they choose to attend.

- **Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, Medal and Scholarship Program**– Nominate by 3/1

The Rensselaer Medal is awarded to a member of the junior class who has exemplified outstanding academic achievement in the math and science fields. This merit scholarship has a value of \$160,000 (\$40,000 per year) and is guaranteed for four years for each Medalist who applies, is accepted and chooses to enroll at RPI.

- **Rochester Institute of Technology, Science & Math Award** –Nominate by 4/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has distinguished themselves academically, is an active and involved member of LHS and the community, and demonstrates an interest and ability in science and math. The Science and Math scholarship is valued at \$76,000 (\$19,000 per year) if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT.

- **Rochester Institute of Technology, Business and Leadership Award** – Nominate by 4/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has distinguished themselves academically, is an active and involved member of LHS and the community, and demonstrates interest and ability in business, leadership and entrepreneurship. The Business and Leadership scholarship is valued at \$76,000 (\$19,000 per year) if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT.

- **Rochester Institute of Technology, Humanities and Social Sciences Award** – Nominate by 4/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has distinguished themselves academically, is an active and involved member of LHS and the community, and demonstrates an interest and ability in humanities and social sciences. The Humanities and Social Sciences scholarship is valued at \$76,000 (\$19,000 per year) if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT.

- **Rochester Institute of Technology, Women in STEM** – Nominate by 4/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has distinguished themselves academically, is an active and involved member of LHS and the community, and demonstrates high achievement, ability, and interest in science, computing, robotics, and/or math. The Women in STEM scholarship is valued at \$76,000 (\$19,000 per year) if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT.

- **Rochester Institute of Technology, Art and Design Award** – Nominate by 4/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has distinguished themselves academically, is an active and involved member of LHS and the community, and has used creative and innovative thinking in areas such as art, crafts, design, film, animation, or photography. The Art and Design scholarship is valued at \$76,000 (\$19,000 per year) if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT.

- **Rochester Institute of Technology, Computing** – Nominate by 4/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who has distinguished themselves academically, is an active and involved member of LHS and the community, and has demonstrated a high level of knowledge in computing. The Computing scholarship is valued at \$76,000 (\$19,000 per year) if the recipient is accepted and enrolls at RIT.

- **St. Bonaventure University Bonnies Scholarship** – Nominate by 5/1 (max of 7)

This scholarship awards students based on qualities that reflect the core values of St. Bonaventure University, including academic excellence, community, integrity, wisdom, leadership, social responsibility, compassion, and an appreciation for diversity. This scholarship carries an \$80,000 scholarship (\$20,000 annually) over 4 years of study at SBU.

- **St. Lawrence Book Award** – Nominate by 3/1

In recognition of the value that the St. Lawrence community places on service to others, the St. Lawrence Book Award honors high school juniors who have distinguished themselves in their communities by their significant commitment to community service. In addition to the book awarded, recipients are awarded a \$4,000 scholarship (\$1,000 per year) if they apply and are admitted to St. Lawrence University.

- **St. Michael's Book Award for Academic Achievement and Social Conscience** – Nominate by 5/1

This award recognizes students' academic success and exemplary community service involvement. Their accomplishments embody St. Michael's commitment to intellectual achievement, social justice and concern for others. This is a renewable, four-year scholarship ranging from \$22,000 to full tuition for recipients who attend St. Michael's College.

- **Student Sage College Award** – Nominate by 4/1 (max of 6)

The Sage Colleges is pleased to present this award in recognition of the characteristics of academic excellence and community involvement. The recipient embodies the Sage motto, "To Be, To Know, To Do" through her achievements and involvement, and in doing so, brings well-earned recognition to the learning community here at LHS. The Student Sage Award guarantees a merit scholarship of at least \$18,000 per year to attend The Sage Colleges.

- **University of Rochester (4 awards)**

Each nominee will have their Rochester application fee waived and will be eligible for consideration for a merit scholarship of at least \$5,000 a year.

George Eastman Young Leaders Award – Nominate by 5/1

This award recognizes a member of the junior class who demonstrates academic excellence, strong leadership at school and in the community, and is involved in many extracurricular activities.

Bausch & Lomb Honorary Science Award – Nominate by 5/1

This is an honorary science award, given to a high school junior who has demonstrated exceptional skill and interest in science and math.

Xerox Award for Innovation and Information Technology Award – Nominate by 5/1

This award is given to a high school junior who has demonstrated academic achievement and appreciation for innovation and information technology.

Frederick Douglass and Susan B. Anthony Award – Nominate by 5/1

This award is given to a junior who demonstrates commitment to understanding and addressing difficult social issues, shows leadership and dedication to community action, and academic excellence.

- **Wilkes University Colonel Emerging Leader Award** – Nominate by 4/1

A pre-scholarship of \$8,000 and preferred 1st year housing is awarded to juniors who demonstrate academic potential and who will most benefit from the personal engagement and research opportunities that Wilkes University offers.

- **Wofford Scholars** – Nominate by 4/1

Based on rank in class and PSAT scores, the Wofford Scholars program recognizes juniors who are also active in leadership and service roles in their school and community. Scholarships to Wofford are worth between \$60,000 and \$250,000 over a four-year period.
