		choose, and love because we are created in God's likeness.
		Identify disciples and name ways we can follow Jesus more closely.

Unit 3: Discipleship and Jesus' Laws of Love

Content Taught (Check box)	Date of Completion	Key Indicators and Standards
		Demonstrate the knowledge and understanding of the Ten
		Commandments.
		Explain Jesus' Great Commandment.
		Explain that there are various types of prayer and how to respond to God
		through prayer daily.
		Understand God is present everywhere and why we use God's name
		reverently at all times.
		Describe how celebrating the Lord's Day demonstrates our love for God.
		Explain that everything created by God is precious and why we make
		sacrifices for God and others.



Unit 4: Reconciliation-Jesus' Gift of Peace

Content Taught (Check box)	Date of Completion	Key Indicators and Standards
		Understand the difference between an accident/mistake and a sin. Distinguish between good and bad choices.
		Describe how the Sacrament of Reconciliation is Jesus' gift for peace and forgiveness. Understand the sacrament is a way to stay friends with Jesus.
		Explain that Jesus forgives us through the priest during confession.
		Describe why we pray to the Holy Spirit and how to examine their conscience.
		Define penance (how we make up for our unloving acts) and understand the importance of contrition and absolution.
		Retell the Story of Zacchaeus and explain how Jesus forgave him.

Unit 5: Eucharist- Jesus' Gift of Himself

Content Taught (Check box)	Date of Completion	Key Indicators and Standards
		Describe the gift of the Eucharist as a sign of God's love.
		Define the meaning of Christ's perfect sacrifice. List ways we can make sacrifices.
		Distinguish between eating bread as food and eating the Bread of Life. Retell the parable of the loaves and fishes.
		Identify roles of the priest, the community, and different ministries at Mass.
		Determine how to prepare self for Holy Communion by fasting for one hour.
		Understand that when we say Amen, we are saying yes to the priest and God.

Unit 6: Morality (Family Life)

Content Taught (Check box)	Date of Completion	Key Indicators and Standards
		Identify family members by name and role; List personal trusted adults and their qualities. Communicate to parents and other trusted adults.
		Discriminate between situations appropriate for keeping a promise. Define a secret and identify when it is appropriate to keep one or not.
		Differentiate affection based on relationship or familiarity.
		Practice strategies for conflict resolution and being aware of surroundings.



Recall the 3 R's in child safety (Recognize, Resist, Report)
Identify rules for keeping children/babies safe with parental involvement.
