

# Year 12-13 Building Work Cover Sheet

SUBJECT:	Latin	DATE:	Summer 2025

The purpose of departmental building work is to provide students with a series of engaging tasks that aim to ease transition from Years 12-13 and ensure progress post- Year 12 examinations.

### The aims of this Building work are:

- To consolidate accidence (word-formation) noun cases and verb forms.
- With the above, to consolidate technical terms (technical literacy)
- To revise basic Latin syntax.
- To consolidate reading of Y12 ("AS") texts (literary literacy).
- To achieve contextual understanding of literary set text periods.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Resit instructions are not applicable in Latin.

2.

- 1) Revise accidence (by chanting / memorising) as set out in accidence booklets provided. At the same time, ensure understanding of core meanings of noun cases, verb persons and tenses.
- 2) Craft (slowly and thoroughly) one prose composition: Leigh, 'Latin Prose Composition', 8B (page 47). Refer to model answers for 7C and 6C first to understand standard structure and style.
- 3) Re-write (where so instructed) exam essays on Virgil and Tacitus.

4) Read through for translation purposes set texts already read in class. Note and correct any misunderstandings, gaps in knowledge using commentaries provided; bring any queries to class in September.

## 3. (Optional Wider Reading)

- 5) Read selected Omnibus and similar introductory articles (provided separately via Sharepoint) on both Y12 ("AS") and Y13 ("A2") set texts / authors.
- 6) Pursue History A Level NEA projects, which are based on Roman History and Society of the period studied in Latin Literature.

#### **FOLLOW UP:**

Your building work will be assessed in the following way/s:

- Accidence will be tested alongside vocabulary in the usual fashion.
- Prose composition will be marked out of lessons and reviewed in lessons.
- Essay(s) will be reviewed in class.
- Literature revision will be tested as part of long-term revision programme.
- Literature context will be assessed as a result of lessons and assessment when reading in class / as homework.
