## **Parent Support Prior to Meeting with Teachers**

- The idea here is to help you make your needs and requests clear and succinct.
- I do not suggest sharing this with the educational team, but use this in your notes prior to going in to guide your thoughts and keep you on track.
- These meetings are often emotionally charged and can be very difficult. However, you are the critical person in the meeting and keeping a level head is crucial. By completing this prior to the meeting, it will help strengthen what you really want to let the team know, and make sure you stay on track and effectively advocate for your child's needs and best interests!
