Present at least 3 (three) recent related works from online journal to support the novelty of the research. Present also a clear theory which discussed literature and theoretical concepts behind it. The headings are arranged by Letters Bold and 12 pt Book Antiqua; sub headings are arranged by Numbers, Bold and 11 pt Book Antiqua, 1,5 spacing.

METHOD

The Method section describes in detail how the study was conducted. A complete description of the methods used enables the reader to evaluate the appropriateness of the research methodology. The Participants/Subject/Population and Sample used in the study should be stated. What, how, to whom the instruments used in the study should be explained. How the data was analyzed in the study should be described.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

In the **Result** section, summarize the collected data and the analysis performed on those data relevant to the issue that is to follow. The Result should be clear and concise. It should be written objectively and factually, and without expressing personal opinion. It includes numbers, tables, and figures (e.g., charts and graphs).

The **Discussion** section allows you to offer your interpretation and explain the meaning of your results. Emphasize any theoretical or practical consequences of the results. You must relate your work to the findings of other studies. In this case you should discuss reasons for similarities and differences between yours and others' findings. Consider how the results of other studies may be combined with yours to derive a new or perhaps better substantiated understanding of the problem.

CONCLUSION

The main conclusions of the study should be presented in a short Conclusions section. Do not repeat the Results section instead provide significant findigs and contribution of the study. Do not use bulleted points, use paragraphed sentences instead.

REFERENCES

References must be listed at the end of the paper. Do not begin them on a new page unless this is absolutely necessary. Authors should ensure that every reference in the text appears in the list of references and vice versa. References should conform to **APA STYLE. Zotero and Mendeley** application are advisable to utilize. References arranged by 12 pt Book Antiqua; 1 spacing, at least 20 references consists of 75% from online references/journal and 25 percent from text book.
