Abstract (11pt Bold)

The abstract is written in two languages, namely English and Indonesian. The abstract contains a brief overview of the background, objectives, research methods, research results, and conclusions of the study. The abstract contains a maximum of 250 words, single-spaced and written in italics (*italics*) for English abstracts. Below the abstract, keywords are listed consisting of a maximum of six words, with the first word being the most important. The abstract in Indonesian is a translation from English. The editor reserves the right to edit the abstract for reasons of clarity of abstract content.

Keywords : Minimum 3 words and maximum 6 words, (first word, second word, third word)

Introduction (12 pt Bold)

The introduction should contain (in sequence) a general background, a review of previous literature (*state of the art*) as the basis for the statement of scientific novelty of the article, a statement of scientific novelty, and the research problem or hypothesis. At the end of the introduction, the purpose of the article's study should be stated. In the format of a scientific article, a literature review is not permitted as in a research report, but is realized in the form of a review of previous literature (*state of the art*) followed by a statement of the article's scientific novelty.

Citations should be written using bodynote formats such as (Uwuigbe & Ajibolade, 2013), (Wang, 2016), (Muttakin et al., 2015) and relevant to the bibliography (recommended to use the Mendeley application).

Research methods (12 pt Bold)

The research methods used to solve the problem include analytical methods. Figure captions are placed as part of the figure caption , not as part of the figure itself. The methods used to complete the research are described in this section.

In the Research Method, small and non-main tools (commonly found in the lab, such as: scissors, measuring cups, pencils) do not need to be written, but just write down the main equipment series, or the main tools used for analysis and/or characterization, even down to the type and accuracy; Write down in full the research

location, number of respondents, how to process the results of observations or interviews or questionnaires, how to measure performance benchmarks; common methods do not need to be written in detail, but simply refer to reference books. Experimental procedures should be written in the form of news sentences, not command sentences.

Results and Discussion (12 pt Bold)

The results and discussion section contains the research findings and their scientific discussion. Write down the scientific findings obtained from the research that has been conducted, but they must be supported by adequate data. The scientific findings referred to here are not the research data obtained. These scientific findings must be explained scientifically, including: What are the scientific findings obtained? Why did this happen? Why is the variable trend like that? All of these questions must be explained scientifically, not just descriptively, and if necessary, supported by adequate scientifically based phenomena. Furthermore, comparisons with the results of other researchers on similar topics must also be explained. The research results and findings must be able to answer the research hypothesis in the introduction.

Manuscripts can be written in Indonesian or English with a maximum of 20 pages including figures and tables. Manuscripts must be written according to this article template in a print-ready format (Camera ready). Articles must be written in A4 size (210 x 297 mm) and with a left margin of 3 cm, a right margin of 3 cm, a bottom margin of 3 cm, and a top margin of 3 cm. Manuscripts must be written in Times New Roman font with a font size of 12 pt, single-spaced, and in a single-column format (except for the article title, author's name, and abstract). The distance between columns is 1 cm.

Foreign words or terms are italicized. Avoid using foreign terms in Indonesian articles. New paragraphs begin 1.15 cm from the left margin, and there is no space between paragraphs.

Tables and Figures are placed in a group of text after the table or figure is referenced. Each figure must be given a figure caption below the figure and numbered sequentially followed by the figure title. Each table must be given a table caption and numbered sequentially above the table followed by the table title. Figures must be guaranteed to be printed clearly (font size, resolution and line size must be guaranteed to be printed clearly). Figures and tables and diagrams/schemes should be placed according to the column between groups of text or if they are too large placed in the center of the page. Tables should not contain vertical lines, while horizontal lines are allowed but only for important ones.

The use of tables and figures must be mentioned in the text by mentioning table 1 (table content 11 pt); figure 1 and so on.

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Conclusion (12 pt Bold)

The conclusion describes the answers to the research hypothesis and/or objectives, or the scientific findings obtained. It does not contain a repetition of the results and discussion, but rather a summary of the findings as expected in the objectives or hypotheses. If necessary, the conclusion can also include actions to be taken regarding further ideas from the research.

References(12 pt Bold)

All references cited in the article text must be listed in the bibliography section. The bibliography must contain references from primary sources (scientific journals and a minimum of 80% of the entire bibliography) published in the last 5 (five) years. Each article must contain at least 15 (fifteen) bibliographic references and cover the last 10 years. Writing the reference system in the article text and writing the bibliography should use a reference management application program such as: Mendeley, EndNote, Reference Manager or Zotero. Writing references uses the system model from APA (*American Psychological Association*), 7th edition.).
