Keywords: (written in English), consisting of 3 to 5 words. Written in alphabetical order. Keywords are separated by a semicolon (;). Excluding the name of the regulation and the name of the institution.

A. INTRODUCTION

The INTRODUCTION contains the background, theoretical study, problems, gap analysis, the novelty of the research results (state of the art), and ends with the research objectives. The gap analysis contains the gap between *das sollen* and *das sein*. The novelty of the research results (state of the art) contains a description of the research study with previous research (literature review).

The submitted article is original and has never been published anywhere. Articles that have been accepted and have gone through the review process will be published in stages through the Open Journal System (OJS).

Footnotes are written using the Chicago Manual of Style Ed. 17th (fullnote) citation style. Use the Reference Manager application (Mendeley or Zotero) and the font used is Arial 9, left-right aligned (justify), 1 space.

The writing format uses a single-column format with Arial 11 font, 1.5 spacing, Justify, A4 paper (210 x 297 mm), left, top, right, and bottom margins of 2.5 cm each. Manuscripts are written between 4000 and 6000 words.
