Transportation

Those 18 y.o. and under currently can ride public transit for free through the <u>Youth</u>

<u>Opportunity Pass Program</u>. Students must have a physical card or the mobile phone application. Kids 5 y.o. and under always ride free.

Families with students in San Diego Unified who are experiencing homelessness can receive an PRONTO pass for an adult accompanying their student. Eligibility must be confirmed each month for the pass to be reloaded. Students can receive the physical card from CYT. Contact your school counselor or CYT to request.
