Note 1: All University of Kentucky School Social Work Initial Preparation Program options include the Masters Degree in Social Work, with a professional preparation component for School Social Worker.

There are five plans or options included, for persons with different backgrounds in social work, including the advanced standing masters degree for candidates who also completed a bachelor's degree in social work within the past seven years.

Plan 5, provides a pathway to the Rank 1 in School Social Work for candidates completing the program with the UK Advanced Standing Masters in Social Work who have not accumulated at least the 60 graduate hours required for the Rank 1.

The Kentucky Education Professional Standards Board does not require completion of a Praxis content area examination in Social Work for the School Social Worker Certificate.

The conceptual framework for the professional education unit at the University of Kentucky (UK) is guided by the theme, *Research and Reflection for Learning and Leading*. Note 1: The School Social Work Program uses a continuous assessment plan designed to assess candidate proficiency and program effectiveness. Continuous assessment of candidates involves a developmental approach to educator preparation in which candidates are expected to progress toward mastery of standards as they practice and gain competence with increasingly complex pedagogical and professional tasks. The School Social Work Program Faculty uses candidate data to measure the progress of individual candidates throughout the program and then uses aggregated candidate data in the process of determining the effectiveness of the program.

Note 1: The School Social Worker Program is designed to fully prepare social workers for the role of School Social Worker by providing an NASW School Social Work Services standards based curriculum, with strong student support and continuous assessment. The curriculum includes six 3-hour graduate courses and 600 hours of field experiences in a school setting. These courses are designed to develop skills and knowledge needed by school social workers to meet the emotional and social needs of P-12 candidates while addressing barriers to student achievement and school adjustment.

All School Social Worker Program options include the Masters Degree in Social Work, with a professional preparation component for School Social Worker. There are five plans or options included, for persons with different backgrounds in social work, including the advanced standing masters degree for candidates who also completed a BSW (bachelors degree in social work). Plan 5, provides a pathway to the Rank 1 in School Social Worker for candidates who have completed the program with the Advanced Standing Masters in Social Work (with less than 60 graduate hours).

Note: The Kentucky Education Professional Standards Board does not require completion of a Praxis content area examination in Social Work for the School Social Worker Certificate.

Rejoinder to EPSB Comments following the reading of the program submission.

Rejoinder Date: November 5, 2015

EPSB Comment 1: The faculty matrix does not clearly identify the teaching assignments in this program. It appears there may be courses included in the program whose faculty are not identified on the matrix (i.e., EDS 516).

The matrix has been updated to include teaching assignments for all those identified as program faculty.

EPSB Comment 2: It is not clear how the NASW Standards are aligned with the program assessments. The table shows alignment with courses but not with the assessments.

The primary assessment showing alignment with the NASW school social work standards is the field education evaluation tool. (see \School Social Worker Program \ 03 Continuous Assessment \ Assessment 2 Field Placements \ School SW Field Evaluation 2011-2012.doc.) That assessment tool was specifically based on those standards. After 2012 those standards were revised and the new standards were incorporated into the new field education evaluation.

EPSB Comment 3: The syllabus for EDS 516 includes references to EPSB Standards. What are those?

The syllabus has been edited to refer to the Kentucky Teacher Standards.

EPSB Comment 4: Clarify on the curriculum contract the recommendation section. There is a recommendation for certification at Rank 2 level. This is not part of the approved programs (see list above).

The curriculum contract has been edited to correct this problem.
