Culture Many people wear a scarf around their heads to protect themselves from dust and wind. Jewelry-making is a common job for many African people. You can tell where a person is from based on the colors and design of their jewelry. Beliefs & Values Many children who live in villages walk to school. Some must walk a very long way, even when it is hot or raining. The majority of the country is *Christian*. Many people play drums and do traditional African dances. Traditional dances are done to try to heal the sick, celebrate a good bunt, or even to bring the rain

Relationships

Families live together in mud huts or brick houses with metal roofs. Mothers and older sisters carry infants almost everywhere in slings tied across their backs. Greeting someone in their language is very respectful. In Botswana people say hello by saying "dumela" (do-MEL-ah).

Expert Group: Mongolia, Asia

Mongolia is between Russia and China. The Mongolian language is the official language of Mongolia. There are 4.4 million people living in the 48 countries that make up Asia and Southeast Asia. Asia is the largest continent in the world, covering about 30 percent of the Earth's land surface.
Culture People often eat <i>khuushuur</i> , which are dumplings filled with ground meat or potato. Boiled meat is also popular. Clothing is strong and flexible because people often ride horses or sit on the floor in a <i>yurt</i> (a large, round tent that can quickly put up and taken down again). The color and design of clothes represent a person's age and region where a person is from. Money in Mongolia is called Mongolian <i>Tugrik</i> .

are superstitious. For example, Mongolians don't whistle indoors

Expert Group: Germany, Europe

Germany, the seventh-largest country in Europe. Europe is a continent of contrasts, where modern skyscrapers stand alongside buildings from the time of the ancient Greek and Romans. There are 715 million people living in the 47 countries that make up Europe. Europe borders Asia to the east and Africa to the south.
Culture German love to each special savory potato dumplings called Wickelklöse, with red cabbage, mushrooms, chives and pork. Traditional German clothing includes Lederhosen, or leather trousers (pants). Money in Germany is called the Euro, which is used everywhere in Europe.

All German children attend school and must go to college. There is a lot of homework given to students, and the most important subjects are reading, writing and math.
Relationships Germans take great pride in their homes, and they are neat and tidy at all times. Only close friends and family are invited over to someone's house. Germans focus a lot on planning, organization and structure. People are hard workers and like things to be perfect at all times.

Expert Group: Brazil, South America

Brazilian people love to eat <i>feijoada</i> , a dish of rice and black beans					
cooked with various kinds of meat and sausage. Brazilians wear					
traditional clothing for the <i>Carnaval</i> or national celebrations, such as					
baiana dress and other costumes. In the south, the cowboys					
(gauchos) wear a distinctive dress including baggy trousers, called					
bombachas, ponchos, wide straw hats and boots. Money in Brazil is					
called Brazilian Real.					

Beliefs & Values Most Brazilians are Roman Catholic. Brazil has a large number of traditions and celebrations such as the festivities of <i>Carnaval, Semana Santa</i> , and many other Catholic holidays. Soccer is the most popular sport. Brazilians also are famous for <i>Capoeira</i> , a home-grown martial art,based on self-defense practices.

Relationships

Families are usually large, and even extended family members are close with one another. Children usually live with parents until they marry. Brazilians are usually rather affectionate, tactile people. Men shake hands with one another, while women will kiss each others' cheeks in greeting. They will start with the left cheek and then kiss the right.

Canadians usually shake hands to introduce themselves, and may shake hands before departing, as well. Short hugs are more common for closer friends, particularly women.
